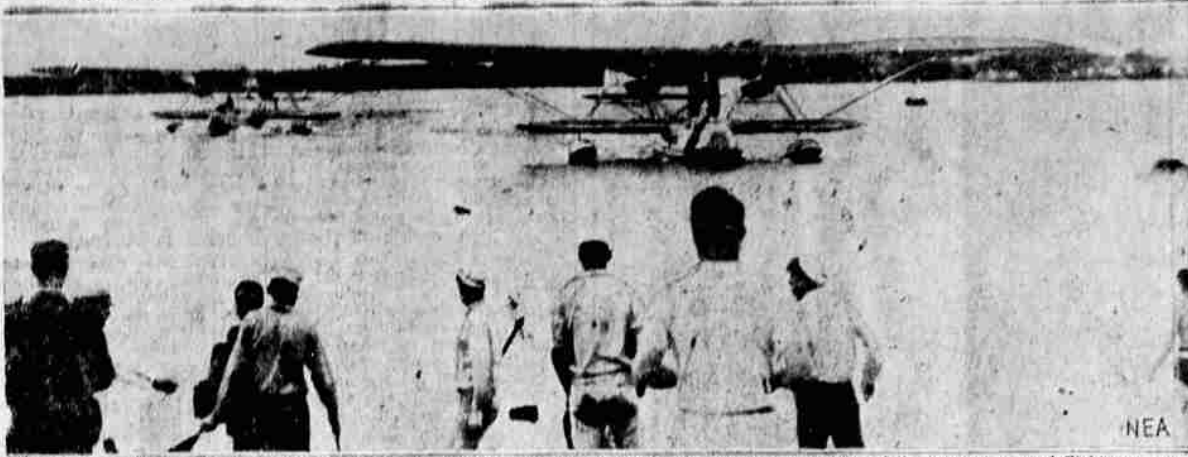

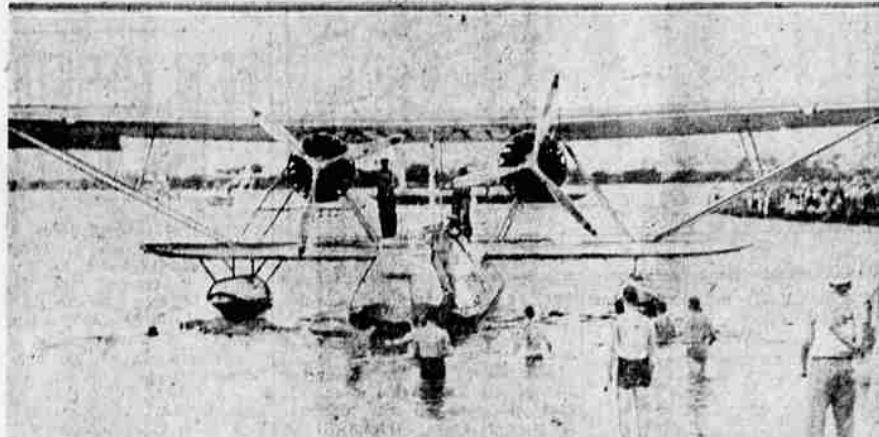
'Routine Transfer' Ends 2150 Miles in 24 Hours



This scene, rushed to you by fast ocean liner and speedboat, graphically depicts the successful conclusion of the greatest massed flight ever undertaken by a military power—a flight of 2000-odd miles over the Pacific from San Francisco bay to Honolulu. Two planes of the navy's crack squadron of six are pictured as they alight to a safe landing at Pearl Harbor, following close behind the flagship 10P1 and the 10P2. Anxious hands await to moor the planes after their great flight.

PORTLAND, Jan. 17. (UP)—George L. Sammis today named the three supervisors for the Oregon state liquor commission.

They are: L. B. Hickam, Portland, who will have charge of the western Oregon district, north.

Edward R. Morris, Eugene, in charge of the western district, south.

Otto J. Runte, in charge of the northeast district.

Salary for the three supervisors

is \$2,000 annually.

Counties included in Hick-

am's district are: Multnomah, Clackamas, Marion, Columbia, Clatsop, Tillamook, Washington, Yamhill and Polk.

Those in Morris' district are: Linn, Lane, Benton, Lincoln, Douglas, Coos, Curry, Josephine, Jackson, Klamath and Lake.

The northeast district comprises the remaining counties. The supervisors will take immediate charge of their districts and will supervise opening of liquor stores and appointment of agents to sell liquor for the commission.

HAVANA, Thursday, Jan. 18. (UP)—Provisional President Carlos Hevia resigned early today. He has been in office since Monday.

HAVANA, Jan. 17. (UP)—Officials at the presidential palace said tonight that Provisional President Carlos Hevia had announced his intention to resign tonight because Carlos Mendietta, nationalist leader mentioned as his successor, found it impossible to support him.

Hevia was said to be preparing an official statement in which it was understood that if Mendietta became provisional head of the government, Colonel Fulgencio Batista, army chief of staff, would become secretary of war and navy.

HAVANA, Jan. 17. (UP)—United States consular and naval authorities made hasty plans today to protect American citizens in Cuba as fresh threats of revolution menaced the island's peace.

A joint program for concentrating the Americans resident in and around the national capital was mapped out by the consular officials. The naval authorities were reported standing by prepared to aid in evacuating Americans in the event the revolt resulted in fighting in Havana.

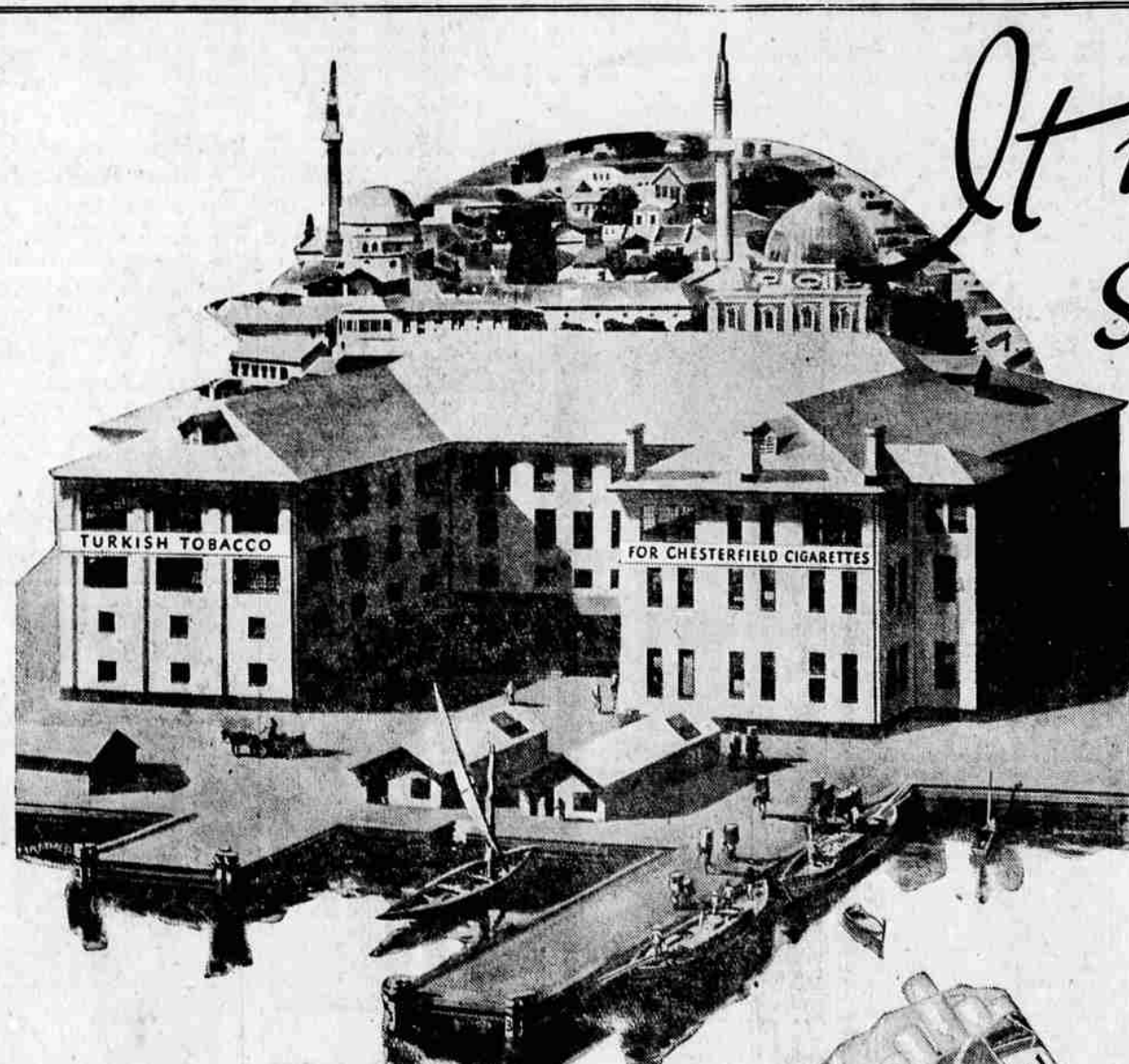
