Signs of Early Spring Noticed Throughout State

HOOD RIVER, Jan. 24. (UP)—Robins are singing here in January, first time in memory that it has occurred. Wild flowers are also reported blooming, indicating an early spring.

FLORENCE, Ore., Jan. 24. (UP)—William Hanson, former florist, made a check of gardens and woods hereabouts, finding 54 different blooms in his floral census.

GOLDENDALE, Wash., Jan. 24. (UP)—Spring flowers are much in evidence along the Columbia river. Trees are beginning to bud. Fall grain shows fine prospects of a bumper crop.

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National, Local Markets

BUTTER PRICE MOVING AHEAD WITH DEMAND

PORTLAND, Jan. 24. (AP)—Butter prices were lifted here for the day as a result of the better demand together with a late decrease in the supply, although shipped in offerings were a trifle larger.

Buying of fresh butter by the government was having the effect of creating a shortage of new churning even though there was a rather liberal output. This was forcing the sale of considerable storage stocks into fresh butter channels.

On the produce exchange prices were lifted for cubes, with butterfat up 1c per lb.

Egg Market Active

Market for eggs continued to show an active but erratic trade tone locally, with receipts liberal and demand good. Prices were so mixed as to make a spread of 3c between sales of similar grade.

Notwithstanding the late attempt to force lower prices for some leghorn hens, there was an active call with prices steady to firm. Little attention was being paid by buyers as to produce exchange values.

Market for country killed meats was showing keenly firm tone here, with practically everything in the meat line reflecting firm prices and an active demand.

Potatoes Strong

Portland consumers were not buying halibut from storage in anything but very scant supply, but there was a fair call for fresh fish of various sorts, with prices held firm.

Market for potatoes was showing a strong tone with recent sharp advances in prices maintained at the source and locally. While recent liberal purchases were not going into consuming channels, but rather into store, it is almost impossible to purchase in the country except at a further advance.

Some trading in onions at primary points of the Willamette Valley was confirmed at \$1.75 net to growers. Local market, however, was inclined to show weakness, but values in general were held.

Household rhubarb market continued demoralized here as a result of rather freely offering of California strawberry outdoor stock, which was selling down to \$1.25 to \$1.50 per 40-lb. box.

Cranberry market was weak, lower and very slow, with about two cars of Eastern in store here. Apple trade continued active and at full prices.

Hot-house cucumbers were in small supply with prices held high. Demand limited.

Cauliflower-broccoli was weaker and lower in spots.

There continued an acute shortage of fresh crab on account of the heavy weather off the coast.
