

EASIER TONE OBSERVED FOR POTATO MART

With the market slightly easier than it was several days ago, potato transactions are few here. Growers generally are holding out for \$1.50, and at the moment there is not much buyers' demand at that price. There are some offers for \$1.50 for February delivery at the buyer's option. Since the sudden price rise here a week ago, quotations have kept pretty much on the level, although there have been a few reports of sales at \$1.65 and bags. California markets are easy, with \$2.00 the top price, and very few potatoes bringing that much. The Chicago market has been off, stimulating a westward movement of spuds.

and that has weakened the western situation. Shipments from Klamath Falls have been averaging 21 carloads a day. This week's shipments on both lines: Saturday, 30 carloads; Sunday, 13; Monday, 20; Tuesday, 16; Wednesday, 22. With between 1700 and 1800 carloads still to go, shipments must run around 550 carloads a month for the remainder of the season to move out the entire crop. September shipments totaled 144; October, 270; November, 231; December, 332.
