FEDERAL PLAN PUZZLES TRADE AT PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Jan. 26, (P)—Advances of 1c in the price on first cubes of butter during the late session of the produce exchange completed the picture of the advances started the previous day as a result of the huge quantities of storage butter which are said to be getting too poor to move into regular trade.

The butter trade was mystified regarding the recent action of the government in demanding only fresh butter for relief purposes, and to aid the industry, when it purchased this stock and put it in storage. This proved no aid to the storage problem, instead, aggravated it. The government now has storage butter for relief while it purchased fresh stock.

Quality of storage butter was said to be unusually poor, which has turned much of the trade away from such offerings.

Trading in the egg market continued erratic, with chief interest on the produce exchange in current receipts, which were selling relatively higher than the better grades.

SAN FRANCISCO MARKET SLOWER

Oregon shipped 42 cars of potatoes, Washington 34, and Idaho 187. Maine shipped 33 cars and Nebraska 52. A total of 377 cars were shipped in the entire United States.

The Presque Isle market was dull, with No. 1 Green Mountain tins quoted at \$1.48 a hundred sacked, in carloads f.o.b. shipping point.

The shipping markets in Idaho reported a light demand, with sales too few to establish reliable prices.

At Yakima demand was active and the market strong. No. 1 Russets brought \$25.00 a ton in carloads f.o.b. cash track.

The terminal market at Chicago was dull, with No. 1 Idaho Russets quoted around \$1.05 a hundred, track sales carlots out-weight.

Fort Worth reported a slow demand, but the market was about steady. No. 1 Idaho Russets brought \$2.15 a hundred, sacked, brokers carlot sales.

At San Francisco demand and trading were slow. With No. 1 Washington Russets going to jobbers at \$1.70 to \$1.80 a hundred, sacked.
