Baer Planning Quick Return to California

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 15. (AP)—Max Baer, heavyweight title contender who has spent the past year in films and night clubs, is due in Oakland this week-end and will resume training. He was assisted by Ancil Hoffman, his manager.

The purpose of the training will be either a fight with Steve Hamas or Primo Carnera, Hoffman said. The Livermore Lardner will get in condition for any eventuality.

Hoffman said he probably would go to New York soon to look over the situation. He has had no new offers, but has a suspicion that Carnera's managers fear that the Carnera-Tommy Loughran fight will not draw well, and that King Levin is not the best logical opponent for the champion. Hoffman said he wanted to scout the possible "gate" of a Hamas-Baer fight.

CHICAGO, Feb. 15. (AP)—The day of the seven-man defensive line is over, Clark Shaughnessy of the University of Chicago has concluded, after studying the recent changes in the collegiate football rules.

"The rules which permits one player to hold the ball for another to kick it, opens up all sorts of possibilities," Shaughnessy said, "and it means the day of the seven-man line is gone. No team on defense can operate any more without a man in the safety position, because there will always be that threat of a kick."

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
