National and Local Markets

PRODUCE MART AT PORTLAND HOLDS STEADY

PORTLAND, Feb. 16. (AP)—Market for dairy products was generally unchanged. Trade in butter appeared steady on the open market with prices unchanged although there appeared ample supplies for every need. Local butterfat quotations were unchanged generally.

Market for eggs continued to show general steadiness in demand and price. Storage movement was slowly increasing but most operators appear to be waiting for the co-ops to name values.

Liberal movement of cheese was reported by Tillamook as well as other Oregon operators with recent price advances well sustained.

Market for live chickens of all sorts was firm with the call for in excess of current local offerings. A further fractional advance was suggested in spots by buyers.

Turkey marketing season was getting a little late with quality inclined to deteriorate somewhat. Prices were still held as high as 19-20c for rears of dressed stock.

Generally firm trading tone was suggested for country killed meats, although ups and downs on live hogs was unsettling. Mutton, lambs and veal were very firm.

While there was only occasional price cutting suggested at the source, sales of potatoes here were being made at rates of 5 to 10c per bushel from last week with a rather slow movement into consuming channels.

With an increasing movement from California even in this direction, there was again a weaker tone for Roseburg and other northwest broccolis. Considerable complaint against packing and grading was reported.
