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faced audience, had the appearance of any civilization convention, including banners and posing for pictures. Speakers were applauded when introduced, and the sessions proved orderly. Speakers spoke slowly, pausing after each statement to permit the murmurs of interpreters to convey the statement in Indian language to many delegates.

The intemperance in the auditorium in which more than 300 Indians had gathered to listen to department of interior officials, was broken when an interpreter inquired of Ward Sheppard, who was explaining the land features of the bill, how to explain the word "communism" in Indian language.

A laughter went through the hall. Sheppard explained the term in English and the interpreter proceeded to convey his thought to the delegate. The term communism had appeared several times in Sheppard's talk.

Tribal delegates, who arrived by train, bus, small and large automobiles, represented the 14 jurisdictions and twenty councils in Montana, Idaho, Washington, Oregon and Northern California.

Banners displayed in the convention hall carried names of tribes from Cour d'Alene, Hoopa Valley, Grand Ronde, Colville, Kootenai, Tualip, Flathead, Kalispell, Yakima, Nez Perce, Umatilla, Siletz, Klamath, Sacramento, Tahoma and Spokane.

All delegates were being entertained at the Chemawa Indian school, but Superintendent James Ryan was put to pressure the last moment for provisions as the result of the fire last Saturday night, which destroyed the school's commissary.

DENIAL ISSUED

CROWN POINT, Ind., March 8 (AP)—Mrs. Lillian Holley, sheriff of Lake county, denied today that she ever posed for a photograph with John Dillinger, the desperado who walked out of her jail.

Sheriff Holley made the statement in reply to criticism from Attorney General Homer Cummings directed against her and County Prosecutor Robert G. E. E. in connection with newspaper photographs.

"Naturally, considering my job, I was among those present when Dillinger was brought to Crown Point," Mrs. Holley said. "Photographs were taken of a group of people, of whom I was one."

NEW YORK, March 8 (AP)—Commenting upon President Roosevelt's declaration for an early return to private air mail transportation, Richard W. Robbins, president of Transcontinental and Western Air, today said: "This does not settle the question of good faith between the government and its air mail contractors."

"The air lines have been the victims of a well conceived plan of a few men with purely selfish interests to ruin the present air transportation system of this country," he continued.

"President Roosevelt has been cruelly misinformed as to the facts of the air mail situation."

"In the course of time all the facts will come out and the American people will understand the real situation."

"In the meantime the air transportation system of this country, which prior to the cancellation of the air mail contracts was admittedly the finest in the world, has done irreparable damage."

Chemist Reports Substance Found To Be Ambergis

SAN RAFAEL, Calif., March 8. (AP)—The ambergis rush in Bolinas Bay, rivaling the mad scramble for gold in '49, was in full swing again tonight on the strength of a San Francisco chemist's report that at least one lump of foul smelling substance found by searchers last week is genuine ambergis, worth \$28 an ounce.

Smith, Emery & Company of San Francisco reported that a two ounce sample of the cheese like stuff submitted for analysis by Louis Pepper was virtually identical physically and chemically with a specimen of genuine ambergis.

Despite the firm's statement that the test referred only to the pepper sample, Marin county and San Francisco residents who had already gathered enough of the substance to net \$100,000—if all is genuine—locked the putrid samples in their ice boxes and returned to the beach tonight with flashlights and lanterns.

Moscow Official Says War Remote

MOSCOW, March 8. (AP)—War in the Far East is considered remote by official Washington, U. S. Ambassador William C. Bullitt said on returning to his post here today.

Bullitt made this remark in response to a query as to what the United States could do to maintain peace in the Far East.

"I do not expect war in the Far East," the Ambassador replied. "and neither does official Washington."

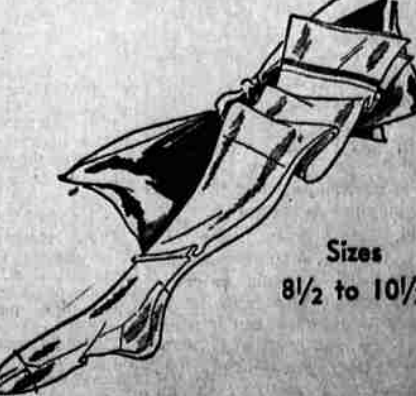
