# National and Local Markets

## EGG MARKET SHOWS SHADED PRICE SCALES

PORTLAND, March 21 (AP)—Market for eggs continued to show shaded or unstable prices despite the announcement of advances made from several sources, checkup of sales to retailers disclosed.

General out of 1/2c in the price of all butter cube scores except 92 was made at the last session of the produce exchange, confirming recent forecasts of a lower market. Butterfat was unchanged.

As a result of the general cutting of these prices, a slower trade was suggested at wholesale but retail business was reported as somewhat improved in many spots.

First home grown apparatus of the season offered in the wholesale trade was reported with sale at \$1.50 dozen bunches to a Portland Heights grocery.

Easier prices were suggested for California apparatus here with continued increase in supplies. Quality shows considerable mixture with resulting erratic asking price by wholesalers. Best around 76 lb.

Market for cauliflower-broccoli continued firm with an occasional truck load from Roseburg and limited local offerings. Sales were being made up to \$1.25 per lb.

There was an extreme demand here for country killed calves and recent higher values were being maintained. Demand was good for all meats except mutton, which were more moderately sought.

Potatoes and onions remained dull, especially the former. Hawaii new potatoes were selling well with small Florida stock scarce.

Rhubarb market demand good for both field and hothouse stock. Halibut prices were being shaded.

## SAN FRANCISCO'S SPUD MART DULL

Potato shipments Tuesday reached a total of 1,047 cars. Oregon supplied 14, Washington 14, and Idaho 132. Maine shipped 237 cars and Minnesota 255. The market at Presque Isle was weaker, with practically no demand. Most of the sales were on a basis of \$1.50 a hundred, sacked, in carloads, f.o.b. shipping point.

Idaho markets were slightly weaker, with demand and trading light. No. 1 Idaho Russets brought 90c to \$1.00 a hundred, sacked, in carloads f.o.b. cash truck.

At Yakima the market was dull. Prices were unchanged. With No. 1 Russets quoted at \$18.00 a ton in carloads f.o.b. cash truck.

At Chicago supplies of old potato were heavy, demand and trading slow, and the market dull. No. 1 Idaho Russets brought \$1.75 to \$1.80 a hundred, sacked, track sales carlots outside.

The San Francisco market was dull. Among the 8 cars received there were three from Oregon. No. 1 Klamath came went to jobbers at \$1.25 to \$1.35, and No. 1 Yakima Russets at \$1.35.

## Highway Commission To Award Contracts

SALEM, Ore., March 21, (UP)—The state highway commission will award contract for the Alsea bridge on the coast highway and will let four smaller bridge jobs and nine highway improvement projects at its meeting in Portland April 5.

The work is located in six counties, and formal notices were being sent to contractors today.

It was announced all of the jobs to be let April 5 are state projects with exception of the Lane county bridges and the Dabeno road project in Lane county.

Included among the improvement projects were:

- Lane county—Dabeno road—Eugene section Eugene—Veneta highway, 2.88 miles roadbed widening, gravel topping and bituminous macadam.
- Low pass—Cheshire rock production project on Siuslaw highway.

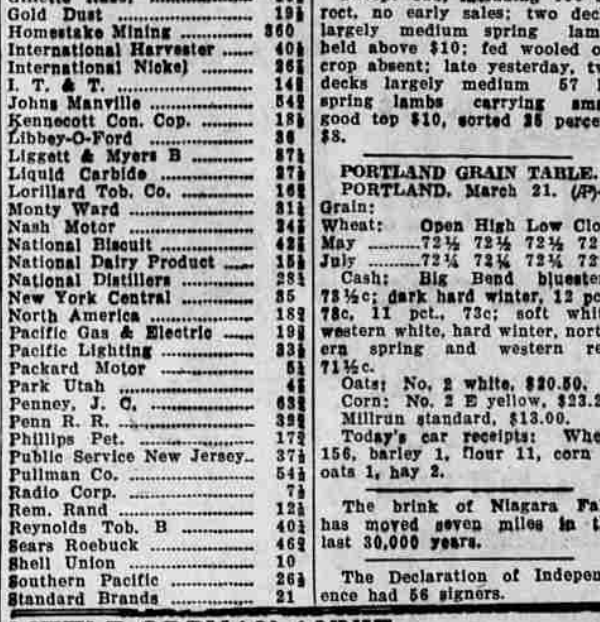
