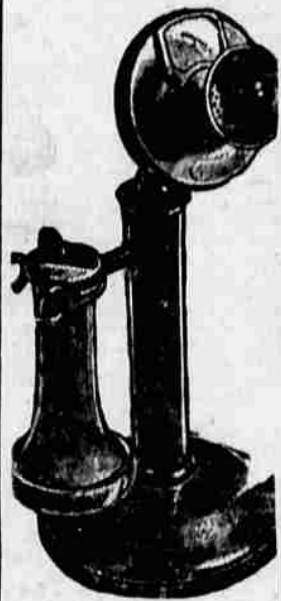

National and Local Markets

PORTLAND MART CUTS BUTTER PRICE 1 CENT

PORTLAND, March 24 (AP)—Cut of 1c in the price on butter during the week-end session of the produce exchange was a gesture by that organization to follow the lead of coast and American centers. Portland prices were officially changed to the point where demand and supply was suggested for some time past.

Butterfat values lost 1c pound generally along with the cut in butter prices.

Egg prices continued to show a wide price spread and general weakness locally despite advances nominally quoted for some grades on the produce exchange. Actual sales do not reflect the advance.

Sluggishness was general in the market for chickens with continued weakness for light hens, on the exchange brokers, however, and the volume dwindled with an increasing supply.

General weakness was suggested for both mutton and lambs in the dressed meat trade with consumers not at all inclined to pay former extreme values. Other meats were unchanged for the week-end.

Extreme weakness continued in the market for onions with a now general disposition on the part of the country to save whatever it can from the wreck which started when an artificial advance was made to \$2.

Improvement in quality of California asparagus was keeping up the volume of sales in that line with a slow gain of offerings of home grown. General offering of the local stock was due within the coming week.

Quite good demand was continued for field grown rhubarb which showed slowly increasing stocks along the wholesale way. Prices were fairly steady.

The latest type of autogiro, designed and built by Juan Cierva, has no wings and the diameter of the three-bladed rotor is correspondingly increased. In a recent test it took off after a run of only 10 yards.

Stock Market Quotations

NEW YORK, March 24, (AP)—Stock market sentiment improved today as further reports from Washington indicated hopes of a compromise in the automobile labor controversy. Led by the motors, many issues recovered fractions to a point or more in relatively quiet trading. The close was firm. Transfers approximated 650,000 shares.

The principal activity occurred in the first half-hour. There was some quick profit taking, however, and the volume dwindled appreciably. Some short covering later brought the list up to around its peak level of the brief session.

Grains, cotton, rubber and silver futures turned up with equities, although there was little buoyancy shown by the commodities generally. Bonds were a little mixed. U. S. government securities received some support. International dollar rates again recorded only slight changes.

Shares of General Motors, Chrysler, Nash, Hudson and Auburn got up more than a point. The rails reflected reports of better traffic and earnings. N. Y. Central, Union Pacific, Santa Fe, Pennsylvania and Southern Pacific were almost as firm as the automotive group.

Dupont rallied more than 2 points and issues up major fractions to more than 1 included U. S. Steel, American Telephone, American Can, Case, Liggett & Myers, B. American Tobacco B, Bethlehem Steel, Sears Roebuck, Montgomery Ward, Goodyear, U. S. Smelting, American Smelting, Western Union and American Locomotive. Most of the aircrafts were active, but their gains were small. The utilities and alcohol were rather narrow.
