**BUTTER PRICES ADVANCING ON PORTLAND MARI**

PORTLAND, April 19, (P)—  
The Portland produce exchange advanced its quotation 1c to 1 1/2c per pound for butter cubes at the late season, to the basis of 30c per pound for cube extras.

The butterfat buying price was advanced the same amount, to a general minimum of 19c for "A" grade, Portland.

While there continued much irregularity in the egg trade, quotations were generally being maintained here at the recent advance to 17c for extras, with over-size at 19c. There has been no change in buying values.

There appeared no change in the general chicken market (one for the day). Light hens were still selling around 12c to 13c with heavy as high as 15c, with Leghorn broilers at 14c for 13 pounds and more. Owing to the weather conditions dressed chickens cannot be safely shipped.

There was a wide spread in selling price on dressed turkeys here, due to the great difference in quality.

While California strawberries were steady as a rule for the day, some offers showed very erratic values. Top stuff generally commanded \$1.25 per crate for 24s. There continued insufficient Oregonians to establish a price.

Lamb Price Lower  
Fractional price lower was showing for country killed calves here as a result of recent cuts in the livestock price. Hogs were about steady, but spring lambs were down 1c to 2c per lb.

Low prices on old potatoes has somewhat increased sales volume again locally, although no buying at country points was suggested in Portland storage.

Lower prices continued to be named for Texas and Florida new potatoes as well as for Hawaii offerings, with the formal offering of new crop California Grapes, shipped from there were due within few days.
