The program will be held on a narrow plateau between Hot creek and Pit river, where trees, grass and flowers abound to make an ideal setting for the time-honored picnic. But no other picnic was ever held where you can see trout swimming at your feet and gaze upon the glorious white Mt. Shasta reaching for the skies—and still in sight of Lassen peak, the only active volcano in America.

This site, so glorious in outdoor splendor, was recognized by the ancient Indians, for on the same spot for centuries they lived in a village, the pits where their homes stood in long rows still visible. On Saturday afternoon, at the McArthur fair grounds, a fine rodeo will take place, with 40 of the wildest horses from the ranges of Modoc, Lassen and Shasta counties giving the West's best cowboys a ride of a lifetime.
