**"Almost Pauper,"
Insull Declares;
No Fear of Trial**

ABOARD S. S. EXILONA. AT SEA, April 23. (UP)—Samuel Inull, fugitive utilities operator, declared today that he is almost a pauper, but that scores of unexpected friends have come to his rescue.

The 74-year-old Insull, enroute back to the United States as a prisoner on charges of fraud in connection with collapse of his \$100,000,000 "empire" described himself in a dramatic light during a conversation with the United Press correspondent.

He was cheerful as he told how adversity had brought tangible help from various sources. The old man spoke pathetically and almost inaudibly as he confessed at length that he was

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
