National and Local Markets

STEADY TONES NOTE MONDAY FOR BUTTER

PORTLAND, April 30, (AP)—Market for butter continued to reflect a steady tone, although the undertone appears a trifle easier. Increasing make was reported, with a greater percentage of top scores.

For the week's opening there was a general lack of price change for eggs locally. Receipts continued to decrease, but quality in the general was better with the passing of extreme hot weather.

Steady conditions were still showing generally in the market for live chickens, with little change suggested in the price list. Receipts from Oregon continued inadequate.

Low price on turkey hens was still creating a good demand for dressed stuff locally, but toms were generally poor and in lesser calls.

Strawberry prices ruled strong to higher generally for the day for quality, little of which was available from California. Local stock was in slightly increased offering and sold steady.

Rather fair increase in offerings of local lettuce was shown with The Dalles contributing liberal and the movement from Libby's to start in earnest Tuesday. Prices are a trifle easier.

Asparagus was in active call; fully steady.

Considerable supply of Hawaii new potatoes has been condemned on account of tuber moth.

Country killed calves continued weak with some carryover; other lines about unchanged.

Better hothouse tomatoes were arriving.

Local peas were selling fairly well at 6c to 7c per lb. generally; a few at 8c per lb.

Cantaloupes were lower again.
