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National and Local Markets

CUBE BUTTER CUT EXPECTED AT PORTLAND

PORTLAND, May 1, (AP)—Cut of 1/2 lb. in the price on cube butter during the late season of the produce exchange, was to be expected in view of the rather rapidly increasing centralizer make as well as greater offerings from out-state points.

For several days there has been quite a noticeable increase in arrivals of butterfat and butter. The former has been of somewhat better quality since the weather became cooler, resulting in an increased churn of top scores, which have been firmest all along.

There continued only limited demand for lowest scores since the state A. B. C. grades went in to effect.

No change was noted in butterfat buying prices.

Butter market situation was practically unchanged for the day here with prices held much the same as during the last 10 days. Storage demand was good.

In general a steady tone was showing for live chickens along the wholesale way. All sorts were meeting with favor.

Weakness was continued in the market for country killed calves with prices a fraction lower in spots and some carryover continued from last week's arrivals.

There was also an Easter tone and some weakness in spots for country killed hogs with quite a lull along Front avenue during the last few days. Lambs and beef were steady.

Booming prices were suggested for navel oranges as a result of the closing of the season. Valencia were already being offered by California.

Improving outlook for grain crops of the inland empire was reported by Ralph McLaughlin, traveling supervisor for Pacific Fruit. He was recently in Walla Walla, Pendleton, Baker and La Grande and reports trade conditions much brighter.

More Oregon strawberries were offered on the East Side Farmers' market but the increase was very limited. Trading was generally \$1.75 crate with a few \$1.90-\$2 for so-called improved Oregon.
