

## LIQUOR BOARD DEFIES MEIER ON SALARIES

He discussed the matter by telephone from Condon. At the board control meeting in Salem last Monday when the board refused to approve salary increases ordered by the commission, Governor Meier took occasion to remark that he did not believe Commissioner Burns endorsed the increased salaries, "as he is too good a business man to do that." "Since the day of its appointment," the McMorran-Harry statement observed, "the commission has been handicapped and sometimes unduly influenced by the governor, and because its members were unable to reconcile their views of the problem confronting them with that of the chief executive, and on occasions have exercised their own judgment rather than followed his suggestions, they have been individually and collectively sniped at during their tenure of office, culminating in the governor's recommendation to the board of control."

The statement remarked that Governor Meier was insistent that Aaron Holtz be employed by the commission as administrator. The commission refused to do this but did put Holtz in a minor position, temporarily.

"He (Holtz) prepared the original price list," the statement continued, "and negotiated the purchase of liquor, which became the cause of much of the commission's trouble."

Further, the statement said, "throughout the life of the organization, Governor Meier has unduly attempted to use his influence, both in appointments of the personnel, designation of agencies and the operation of the business, and has otherwise involved himself in the commission's operations."

there were no bruises on the king's body or hands, Hutchison continued:

**Opposed to War**

"In other words, he was tapped on the back of the head. That is known in Belgium. Nobody dares speak of the death of King Albert in Belgium today."

"The facts are that King Albert was opposed to war."

"He would not play any part in the 'devilry' of France in conspiring for war against defenseless Germany."

"He was a great unifying force between the Walloons and the Flemish."

"I am in a position to say that when Albert I was dead, the communists—who in fact represent the interests of international finance—were able to stand up on their hind legs and yell for revolution," Hutchison said.

LONDON, May 5, (AP)—An enraged official of the Belgian embassy in London today invited Colonel Graham Seton Hutchison to come there and repeat his story of King Albert's death—

promising Hutchison a "sock on the jaw" if he does so.

Indignantly saying he was ready to tell "this Col. Hutchison he is a liar," an embassy spokesman fumed at word from Nottingham that Hutchison had said the late Belgian monarch was slain and did not really die an accidental death while mountain climbing.

BRUSSELS, May 5, (AP)—The Belgian court—the highest authority on the question—to-day issued the following communiqué:

"Everyone is well aware in Belgium an investigation made on the spot clearly proved that Col. Graham Seton Hutchison's statement is deprived of any foundation."

## Broken Motorship Heads to Seattle With Coast Guard

veit of Seattle dashed to the aid.

Four members of the Childar's crew were dead and three lay in a hospital here, severely injured. The toll of the crew of 28 was taken as the ship was tossed and pounded on Peacock Spit at the mouth of the Columbia river yesterday.

Later she drifted out to sea seas over to escape dereliction once on the spit. The Redwing boomed a hawser aboard and helped pull the Childar as the rising seas jarred her free.

Water poured in at a waterline gap of the number four hold and the ship was strained at the middle. The sturdy tug Roosevelt which left Seattle last night was expected to reach the Childar and Redwing about noon today and

help tow the disabled craft to Puget Sound.

Coast guard boats were cruising about searching for bodies of three of the crew who were washed overboard. A fourth member of the crew met his death on deck while the cargo of lumber washed overboard and the ship's masts and superstructures were reduced to a shambles.

The injured were lashed to mattresses, lowered into lifeboats and brought through jolting waves to a hospital here.

The dead:

Helge Andreas Christiansen, 41, chief officer, washed overboard. Bertram Hjonnes, 39, second officer, washed overboard. Ingolf Bertinius Jacobsen, 41, steward, washed overboard. Odd Mervik, 29, first cook, killed on deck.

All were of Norway.

The injured:

Pat McGrath, Portland, Ore., a seaman, fractured shoulder, wrenched back and crushed chest. Karl Ragnar Hansen, 25, second cook, fractured pelvis, broken nose and fractured elbow.

Olav Loftenes, 29, sailor, fractured pelvis.

A 50-mile-an-hour gale caught the Childar and carried her onto the spit early yesterday morning as she emerged from the mouth of the Columbia river.

of Indiana, who has been advanced in some quarters to succeed Everett Sanders as chairman.

No announcement was made after the conference, but it was strongly indicated a move was under way to avoid selection of a new chairman next month if for no other reason than to escape a possible conflict with the joint senate and house campaign committee, headed by Senator Hastings, of Delaware, and Representative Bolton, of Ohio, over running the congressional campaign.

Ralph Williams, of Oregon, vice chairman of the national committee, was described as unwilling to assume the chairmanship, but as ready to carry on the duties of that office as vice-chairman until the next presidential campaign.

Whatever the decision of the Chicago meeting, it was said by

one republican leader that Charles D. Hilles, committeeman from New York, probably would have control of the situation.

There have been reports that Hilles wanted the chairmanship himself, and also that he was a Watson man, but confirmation of this has been lacking.
