National and Local Markets

CHEESE MART SHOWS STEADY DEMAND RISE

PORTLAND, May 7. (P) - Dry weather has at last a big influence in the domestic cheese trade with eastern market conditions generally affected, according to the weekly survey.

Prices in the eastern trade reflected these conditions with a resulting rise of 1/4c lb. generally in the price instead of the lower values normally shown at this period. Demand continued to gain at practically all points.

Recent cutting of prices on the produce exchange here have been out of line not only with local sentiment but with trade in the country generally.

Trading in butter was about steady here with most interests calling upon the exchange here to ignore the fight for control in San Francisco which was wrecking values there to aid storage operators.

Fully steady trade was continued in the market for eggs. Buying and selling prices alike were unchanged for the week's opening.

Local trading tone was showing for chickens in the local market with the buying price on light hens generally 12c lb. with heavy colored sorts to 14c lb.

Liberal demand was again showing for dressed turkeys with distributors paying up to 16c lb. net for top quality birds, in fact.

The selling price in line with the buying price in hens here.

Opening prices on Oregon strawberries were boosted today but soon melted with rather liberal supplies. Sales of gold dollars finally dropped to \$1.65 with a dime more for improved Oregon.

The Dalles offered early cherries to Portland and initial supply was due from there. California have been in small supply but some Bing were due from the south within the next few days.

Sheep: 11,000; scattered live spring lambs and limited supply aged sheep opening around steady but early undertone on both woolled and clipped lamb offerings weak to 25c lower; woolled lambs indications \$10.00 downward on bulk; asking around \$9.00 to \$9.25 for good to choice clipped offerings; native springers, \$11.00; others, 10c upward to \$11.50; shorn ewes, \$4.00 to \$4.25.

World Warred To Eliminate War Threats

WASHINGTON, May 7. (UP) Secretary of State Cordell Hull Saturday discussed prospects of war but urged that there be no undue pessimism over the "feverish armings" of numerous nations.

"While there are no signs of immediate war anywhere, it is true that seriously volcanic conditions exist in many parts of the world," he said here in an address before the Alumni association of Cumberland University, Lebanon, Tenn.

"Education is all important at this stage," he continued. "It would be both a blunder and a crime for civilized peoples to fall much longer to take notice of present dangerous tendencies which negative every idea of friendliness and of the spirit of the good neighbor."
