

HEAT SPELL SENDS WHEAT PRICE HIGHER

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Mississippi valley. The showers, however, were not expected to bring anything but slight relief from high temperatures which supplied an anti-climax yesterday to a month of dust storms and extreme aridity.

Temperatures of 103 degrees were common in Kansas and Missouri yesterday while their northern neighbors sweated under the full blast of the heat wave.

Inwood, Ia., topped the day's record with 111 degrees and Aberdeen, N. D., was not far behind with 110. At Freeport, Ill., the mercury shot up to 106, and at Minneapolis to 106.3. Schools at those two cities and at Des Moines and Keokuk, Ia., were dismissed.

TWO STRIKES THREATEN.

WASHINGTON, June 1. (AP)—Hugh S. Johnson told reporters at his press conference today he was making every effort to prevent the threatened steel and textile strikes but that conferences had not advanced sufficiently to make specific plans.

The administrator, commenting on the steel situation, said if the union could show any outright refusal by any company to bargain collectively with duly chosen representatives of the workers, he would "back them all the way."

"To invoke the penal and injunctive provisions for violation of Section 7A, (collective bargaining)," he explained, however, "a proper groundwork must be laid showing freely chosen representation for bargaining, and refusal of such tender."

"In my opinion that groundwork has not as yet been laid in the steel controversy," Johnson spoke on the basis of three or four hours' conference yesterday with Mike F. Tiche, president of the Amalgamated Association of Iron, Steel and Tin Workers.
