A circuit court jury found Josus Jara guilty of possession of Canibus Indice, Thursday.

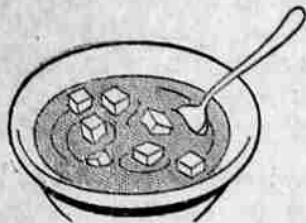
Sentence will be passed by Circuit Judge W. M. Duncan, Friday morning.
