Dumb Human in Jail 10 Years Without Name

EL PASO, Texas, June 14, (UP)—A nameless, dumb human being known only as the "monkey boy" has been in jail here for 10 years. After the society after spending \$2,700 for his board, would like to be rid of him.

The "monkey boy" was found living in a chicken coop when he was about 23 years old. He cannot talk, makes guttural animal noises. But he understands spoken English.

Persons who signed the complaint on which he was apprehended left El Paso before the young man was tried. He has remained in jail since.

The "monkey boy" appears to be a Mexican. But authorities cannot prove that he is a citizen of Mexico, so he cannot be deported to that country. Likewise, they cannot prove that he is an American citizen, so state institutions will not accept him.

He sits in a peculiar, animal manner. He looks about him constantly while feeding, guards his food closely as if he expected someone to take it away from him.

Potato Crop Not Damaged by Frost

The Klamath basin potato crop is recovering nicely from effects of the recent frost, according to County Agent C. A. Henderson. The frost came before the spuds had grown sufficiently to be vulnerable, and under the influence of a warm sun the plants are now coming along in excellent shape, Henderson said.

Estimated increase in the potato planting in the basin is 1000 acres this year, Henderson said. Drought conditions in other potato growing sections, indicating a possible shortage and better prices, have been one factor encouraging potato planting.

Divorce Records Broken in Juarez

JAUREZ, Mex., June 14, (UP)—All previous divorce records set by the Juarez civil court were shattered Wednesday, 31 quick and easy divorces, all for discontented American couples, were granted.

Judge Ignacio Gutierrez Zamora, who signed all the decrees, has been signing from 6 to 23 divorces a day for more than a year. "Juarez has become the world's greatest divorce center," said Attorney Frederick Munoz, who specializes in mutual consent divorces for Americans, but who will accept practically any kind of a case from any part of the world.
