

STATE OFFICERS ARREST FOUR MEN

State policemen, well armed and prepared to use an automatic rifle, captured four men Wednesday morning, and identified them as the Shaddock brothers of California. The arrest was made by surprise tactics on a private road on Lord's point, on Upper Klamath lake.

Officers said they were holding Fred and Irvin Shaddock for Siskiyou county, and that the other two, Luey and Pete Shaddock, are held on charges of using a car with a void foreign license and trapping without a license. The state police and sheriff's office cooperated in making the capture.

Fred and Irvin Shaddock were wanted for burglary at Weed on July 26, 1934. Fred was arrested shortly after the Weed job, and later that day escaped jail at Dorris. Irvin was not captured at that time.

Officers charged that the Shaddock brothers have been trapping for muskrat without a license.

The four brothers were taken to the county jail, and were held there pending further action in their cases. At the time of their capture they were riding in a car. A shotgun was the only weapon found in the automobile.

Local Physician Notes War Spirit Spreading In Europe

General unrest and a spirit of militarism are rampant in virtually all the countries of Europe at present, according to the impressions of Dr. Paul W. Sharp, who with Mrs. Sharp, has just returned from a six months trip abroad.

None of the nations are in a position either financially or economically to wage war, however, and in the opinion of the local physician, these facts alone have presented definite conflict.

Many Nations Visited

Dr. and Mrs. Sharp left Klamath Falls on April 27, flying their own airplane. They visited the Mayo clinic in Rochester, Minn., attended clinics in Chicago and spent a short time in New York.

They sailed from New York on May 15, landing at Liverpool, England. Their travels took them over England, Scotland, Norway, Sweden, Finland, Denmark, Russia, France, Austria, Hungary, Italy and through Switzerland and Spain.

The Sharps spent seven weeks in Vienna, during which time he took post-graduate work, specializing in surgical conditions of the genito-urinary tract. He also took orthopedic work, gynecology and work in children's diseases.

Russia Reported Active

Dr. Sharp attended clinics in all the major cities of European countries, and observed the work of the finest surgeons. He also attended the University of Upsala in Sweden.

The Sharps found Russia the most interesting country they visited, and were impressed with the amount of activity and work being done, as well as the magnitude of the projects planned.

Health and sanitation programs are being enforced, and workers are being given cultural advantages never enjoyed before. Underneath, however, discontent is brewing, and Dr. Sharp believes that communism will eventually tear down that which it has built up in Russia.

Germany United

Germany is united in its support of Hitler, the doctor observed, and Germans feel that but for Hitler their country would have followed in the path of Russia with a similar five year plan.

There is no discussion of the Jewish program in Germany, however, Dr. Sharp asserted, with everyone avoiding the subject and refusing to talk about the Jews.

None of the European countries has recovered from the World war, and the people blindly follow allegiance quickly as the government changes in order to conform with the power wielded by the whip hand.

Changes Due in France

Big political changes in France are expected in the near future, according to authentic sources abroad, Dr. Sharp asserted.

From observations made dur-

ing his European travels, Dr. Sharp believes that the Italian-Ethiopian situation will prove to be less serious than is now feared. He believes that an agreement will be reached between Italy, France and England before actual war occurs.

Dr. and Mrs. Sharp spent some time in New York upon their homeward journey, flying back over the southern route through Washington, D. C., St. Louis, Texas and Los Angeles.

"America is the finest place in the world in which to live," Dr. Sharp said Wednesday, "and we are very glad to be home again."

Graveling Hastened on County Highway

TULELAKE, Oct. 24.—County equipment and employees are making good progress on the work of graveling the east-west road through Tulelake and it appears that with the rapid progress continued for two more weeks at least a surface covering will be placed on the entire road and all necessary refilling

of developed holes will be accomplished.

Besides the east-west graveling work, the county expects to gravel some of the feeders into the new highway at the northern edge of the Tulelake basin.

County Supervisor Jacobs stated on his last visit to this section that their work would continue as long as weather would permit.

Material being placed on the roads here is highly recommended by engineers of the highway department. They state that the gravel contains enough sand and a binder to cause it to pack and thus become a hard surface which will drain off water to a great extent.

The Mason and Dixon line has been found, by modern surveyors, to be as much as 400 feet from its correct location, but to correct it now would necessitate changing of other boundaries throughout the United States.
