

POPE FAVORS ITALY'S AIM IN ETHIOPIA

ROME, Friday, Nov. 1. (UP) Pope Pius early today came forward squarely in favor of granting a mandate over Ethiopia.

In the view of the holy father the mandate should be granted to Italy to avoid "more dangerous conflagration."

The pope's viewpoint will be revealed in a leading editorial in the next issue of the "Civiltà Cattolica." The publication will appear Saturday.

Fire Protection
The Civiltà Cattolica in the leading Catholic publication of the world and its most important editorials are written under the direct supervision of the holy father.

The editorial will contend, in outspoken fashion, that the League of Nations should not hesitate any longer to grant a mandate over Ethiopia to Italy if it wishes to prevent still greater conflagrations in Europe and perhaps in the whole world.

The editorial will point out that Italy is entitled to a mandate, if not by the considerations of strict justice at least by consideration of equity, because Italy received nothing in the "fat distribution" of mandates over the ex-German colonies at the end of the World War.

Other powers received colonies at the end of the great war but Italy received none.

WASHINGTON SILENT

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1. (UP) Department of state officials Thursday refused to comment on the stand by Pope Pius that Italy should be granted a mandate over Ethiopia to prevent further spread of the "conflagration."

LONDON, Friday, Nov. 1. (UP) The new attitude adopted by Pope Pius in recommending an Italian mandate over Ethiopia probably will not influence British policy in the least or cause her to alter her stand at Geneva, well informed quarters said today. However, they added, Britain is prepared to consider any settlement of the Italo-Ethiopian war which is acceptable both to the League of Nations and Emperor Haile Selassie.

VATICAN CITY, Nov. 1. (UP) League of Nations sanctions against Italy will not affect the Vatican in any way, Pope Pius informed bishops throughout the world Thursday.

Ecological seminaries and institutions of the Catholic church, such as those in North America, England, Ireland, Brazil and Latin America, will not feel any pressure as result of penalties against Italy, the pope said.

GENEVA, Friday, Nov. 1. (UP) —The indirect declaration of Pope Pius XI, urging that the League of Nations grant a mandate over Ethiopia to Italy to avoid a new world conflagration, astounded league officials today. The first reaction of leading members of the league was one of "complete amazement."

Officials were the more surprised in view of the pope's earlier neutral attitude.

It was 4 a. m. when the news reached Geneva but newspaper men called league officials from their beds.

HYDE PARK, N. Y., Nov. 1. (UP) — President Franklin D. Roosevelt was informed of the pope's action Thursday by the United Press. He had no immediate comment.

Bremerton Woman Evident Victim of Poison Death Plot

BREMERTON, Wash., Nov. 1. (UP)—Mrs. Tilda Mantyla, 52, poisoned by carbolic acid, died Thursday, the apparent victim of a mysterious murder.

Prosecutor Warren Miller of Kitsap county ordered an inquest tomorrow. Preliminary examination showed the acid apparently was administered forcibly to the Finnish widow at her home in Poulsbo, near Bremerton.

Mrs. Mantyla died about an hour after she was found unconscious in her bed by Mr. and Mrs. William Peterson, neighbors.

She was clad in a night gown. Papers and other effects were strewn about the floor of the house. Both the front and rear doors were locked from the outside, keys remaining in the locks. There was no sign of the bottle that contained the acid.
