

PENSION PLAN LOOMS BIG AS BALLOT ISSUE

Against his solemn warning against Mahoney, Williams, it is suspected here, may be fearful that the politically shrewd Klamath mayor may beat him to some endorsement through headquarters.

All of this discussion, of course, brings up the question as to what Mahoney is gunning for. Some profess to know he has plans to run for the U. S. senate. Others think he will compete with Congressman Pierce for the democratic congressional nomination. Incidentally, there is a report that Rev. Williams might want to run for the senate, while Frank Mortenson, local townsender, writes that Brother Williams "wanted the position of governor of Oregon, etc."

Mortenson has prepared a scorching reply to Williams for his attack on Mahoney. Here it is:

Mahoney, Bunnell vs. Rev. Williams

"The Rev. Williams seems fearful that Mr. Mahoney, the mayor of Klamath Falls, Oregon, and Mr. Bunnell, assistant state manager of the Townsend Plan in the state of Oregon, are very dangerous to the Townsend movement and if not put out of the picture will ruin the Townsend forces in Oregon. In my mind no two or two hundred men can stop the Townsend movement, for it is backed by the strongest forces that ever backed any movement in this great country of ours. Neither am I afraid of the type of people. Not men that the Rev. Williams represent."

"But to answering the letter Rev. S. C. Williams of Portland, Oregon, to our local newspaper. 'I had not been on the train 26 minutes till Rev. Williams squared himself in front of me as I sat across the aisle from him, and proceeded to tell me about Mr. Mahoney and the reverend had not talked long till I had quite clearly the desires of Rev. Williams. For example, he had wanted the position as governor of Oregon, etc.'"

"I very quickly decided that Rev. Williams was not only for personal glorification and to his sorrow he found no place for such selfish desires either on the train going or coming or at the convention. When the reverend found out I knew Mr. Mahoney he wanted to know why Mahoney did not back the Zimmerman forces. I told him that Mr. Mahoney happened to know before election what we all now know, that Mr. Zimmerman was not a Townsend agent. Rev. Williams began to retort about to have Mr. Mahoney. The delegates decided to give Mr. Williams plenty of rope and watch him either hang Mr. Mahoney and Mr. Bunnell or himself. The result was pitiful. I have a peculiar sense of pity and I never get any degree of pleasure out of seeing anybody kill himself. Rev. Williams did such a blundering job of hanging himself that I am forced to admit that it was at times amusing, although I cannot say I got any particular pleasure out of it, and before we reached Portland on our return, Rev. Williams was the hiss and by-word with the most of the delegates, and he was one of three delegates from Oregon that made monkeys of themselves. The other two were not Mr. Mahoney or Mr. Bunnell."

"The telegram read by myself on the train that the Rev. Williams thinks was faked. Oh, how can men of God be so doubtful when there's nothing in their hearts but love for the children of men. 'But he doubts it any way, so I am going to give it to you now, here it is, and I will show the original to the News-Herald for their O. K.'"

"Women and the power they wield over politics, crime, and welfare agencies," was the subject of a talk presented before the League of Women Voters Tuesday morning by Mrs. Howard Barnhisel.

Mrs. Barnhisel in her paper discussed the wide range of interest in the political, economic and social world maintained by the National League of Women Voters, and urged the local branch to perfect its organization in order to act against crime and dishonorable politicians. She also pointed out that crime has left the highways and entered the social world, stating that the prevalence of kidnapping has closely touched even the humblest home.

The league went on record as favoring a resolution submitted from various organizations of the city asking that the type of moving picture shown on week-ends when audiences are largely made up of children, be improved.

Klamath Airport Project Assured

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for people on relief. They are requested to furnish all necessary material, equipment or other costs exclusive of labor, at the expense of the local agency.

Must Meet Conditions

Priority of the project depends on the amount of contributions for equipment and materials. Thomas said the city has submitted several projects asking WPA to furnish materials, but none has been approved as yet. This, however, does not affect chances for the airport, because that job is favored as a special program.

Two WPA projects or the city were started on November 12. All equipment and materials for the projects is being provided locally, that for one of them coming through the help of a private party.

Thomas pointed out that the type of project must meet conditions peculiar to the community regarding the type of labor available.

"For instance," he said, "if there are no carpenters and concrete men on relief, there is no use to propose a project to put up a building."

"I have had an engineer project in as a work relief job for a long time. But there weren't any engineers on relief, so the project never was started."

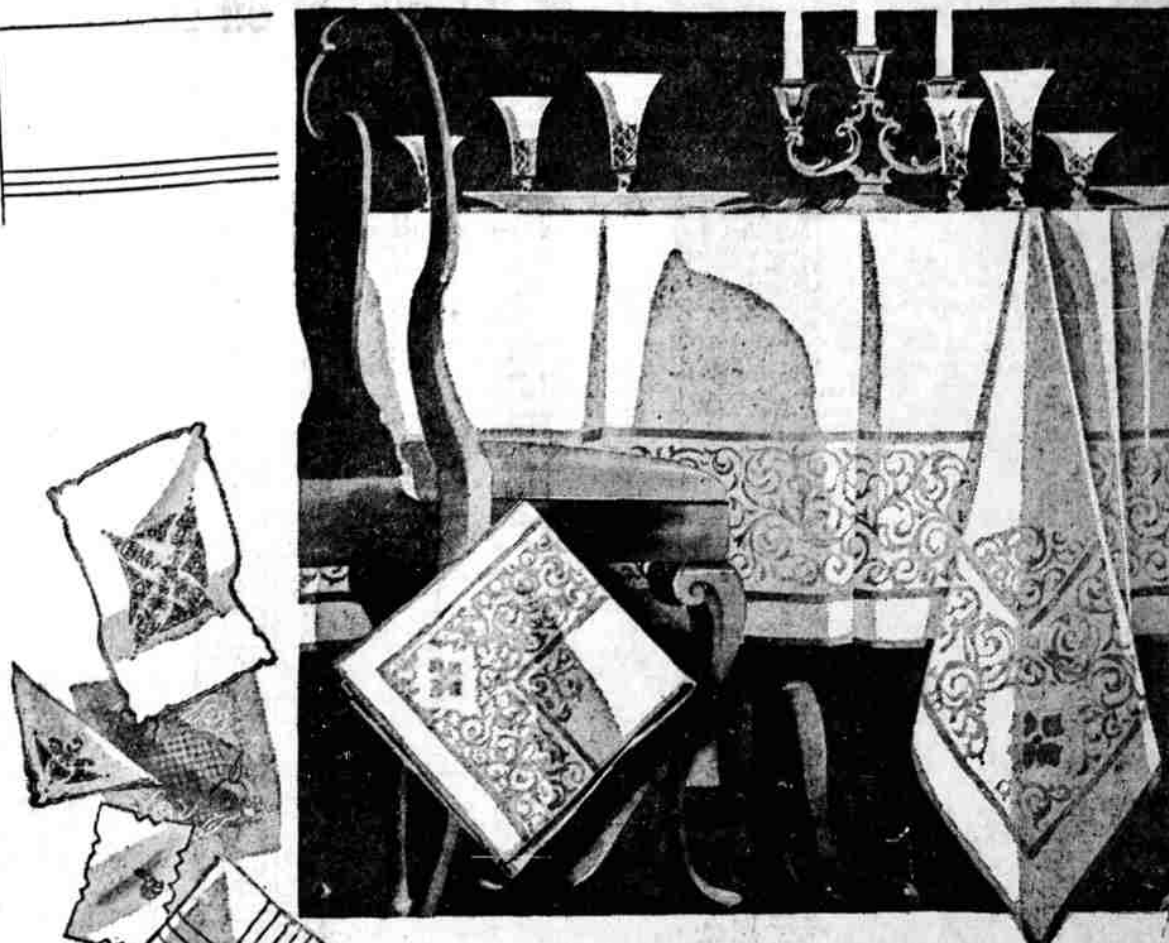
