Hopkins said: "The program depends entirely on what action congress will take. I am not going to indicate an opinion about

the funds that will be required or the number of people that will need benefits, but I am sure of one thing, that the government and the states and cities have put their hand to this plow and that it is never again going to be taken away."

## Machine Gunner Dies of Wounds

ASMARA, Eritrea, Nov. 21. (AP)—Sergeant Dalmasio Birago, the only Italian casualty in the aerial bombardment of Buia, died of his wounds today.  
Birago was the machine-gunner in a plane piloted by Captain Ostini. He was wounded in the leg, but kept shooting until too weak to pull the trigger. He had been recommended for the medal for valor.  
The Ethiopian dead in the fighting is placed by Italian military authorities at 2,000.

## OHIO STRIKE RIOTS OCCUR

Pottery Workers union after demands for a 23 per cent wage increase, an eight-hour day and time and a half for overtime, all of which the company refused.

BARBERTON, Ohio, Nov. 20. (UP)—Infuriated strike pickets, half blinded and nauseated by barrages of gas and defeated in a series of hand to hand skirmishes with company guards, returned to the attack on the strike-besieged Ohio Insulator company plant today.

Shouting defiance and pushing forward through clouds of acid fumes, the pickets wielding clubs and swinging fists repeatedly clashed with guards and deputy sheriffs.

Gas Shells Inexhaustible  
Each time the strikers were repulsed, but each time the fight waged more fiercely. Grounds around the pottery plant were turned into a veritable battlefield.

A score of pickets—all of whom are members of the National Brotherhood of Operative Pottery or their sympathizers—were injured by the gas or the fists of the company guards. Several were sent to hospitals. Dozens of others were injured by bursting tear gas shells, of which the guards had an apparently inexhaustible supply.

The guards drew up their ranks, reloaded their gas guns and again descended on the rioters. The strikers, pale-faced and wretched from the effects of the nauseating gas, fell back time and again only to reform their stubborn ranks.

**New Attack Expected**  
Strikers withdrew from the battle as night closed down with the exception of a few hardy pickets who continued to snipe at the guards with bricks and clubs thrown from behind nearby houses. The area still reeked with tear gas. Guards were constantly alert for a renewed attack which they were certain would come during the night.

# BRITAIN'S NAVY HONORS JELlicoe

LONDON, Nov. 21. (AP)—The British navy dipped its ensign today in memory of Earl Jellicoe, commander of the grand fleet in the only major naval battle of the great war, who died yesterday, after a short illness, at the age of 78.  
The funeral was set for Monday.

The British press, forgetting the bitterness with which some of its representatives criticized the earl after the battle of Jutland, united today in paying tribute to the "great sailor whose name will forever be linked with Nelson's."  
Former Prime Minister David Lloyd George, whose war memoirs accused the admiral of a "sorry exhibition of nervous impotence," also spoke in respect to the earl's memory.  
The admiralty, announcing the funeral arrangements said the body would rest in St. Paul's cathedral, where the Duke of Wellington and others of the empire's great are buried.

Experts said the life of the cabinet might possibly depend upon the outcome.  
Hitrota is expected to support the compromise suggested by Ambassador Akira Ariyoshi following his interview yesterday with Gen. Chiang Kai-Shek, by which Nanking would be permitted to retain a considerable degree of sovereignty in North China.

The newspaper Asahi asserted that Ambassador Ariyoshi, whom the militarists long have accused of softness in dealing with the Chinese, submitted his compromise proposal to Tokyo with the comment, "This is likely to be my last service to the emperor." Indicating he would resign if the army leaders prevailed.
