Jay Berwanger Named Big Ten's Leading Athlete

CHICAGO, Dec. 6. (AP)—Jay Berwanger again—a mile. For the second straight year but with a far greater margin than before, the Dubuque, Iowa, boy, who became a football immortal at the University of Chicago today, was named the outstanding athlete of the western conference in a poll of writers and experts who follow the conference's activities.

Jesse Owens, Ohio State's "one man track team," offered the only serious opposition to Chicago's "one man football team," but was buried under an avalanche of Berwanger votes, 41 to 20. Only two others figured in the voting—George Roscoe, Minnesota's all-around star, and Bill Renner, forward passing genius of Michigan.

Berwanger, idol of millions who cheer for the "under dog" in sports competition, was called a greater football player than even Red Grange by some of the writers.

Comparing him with Grange, Coach Bob Zuppke of Illinois said: "Grange was more subtle and took more punishment than Berwanger. Jay gave out more punishment than he absorbed."

Ralph Cannon of the Chicago Daily News said Berwanger rated as one of the greatest all-around athletes since Jim Thorpe.

"Give Jay a pair of shoes and the Minnesota line, and he'd be the all-American team," wrote John O'Donnell, sports editor of the Davenport (Iowa) Democrat and Leader.

Ronald McIntyre, sports editor of the Milwaukee Sentinel, said Berwanger is the greatest back offensively and defensively, anywhere in 20 years.
