

IMPROVEMENT OF REFUGES PLANNED

MALIN, Dec. 20.—An extensive program of improvement work on bird refuges on three preserves, Clear Lake, Tule Lake and Upper Klamath Lake, is contemplated by the biological survey with labor to be furnished by members of the Dry Lake veterans' camp, east of Malin, according to Clark W. Fensler, camp superintendent, who is stationed at Dry Lake.

The program calls for erection of four wooden towers to be placed at advantageous points around Tule Lake for the use of game officials; construction of banding pens in which migratory birds will be confined prior to release after banding; recovery pens for observation of sick birds and planning of bird covers.

Large areas of the refuge on Upper Klamath Lake are to be fenced and springs adjacent to the refuges are to be cleaned and walled for the benefit of livestock grazing in the districts. The survey also plans to seed marshes about Clear Lake with wild rice, plant tubers and grains suitable for wild fowl feed to supplement other natural food in the lake area.

Some years ago a similar program was carried out with gratifying results on Upper Klamath Lake by John Perl, Medford, who owns a summer home near Rocky Point. The marsh between Rocky Point and Cherry Creek was generously covered with a variety of seeds and bulbs on which ducks and geese feed, as an experiment. While no authentic data is available on the resultant growth, residents of the district acknowledge that feed is increasing since that time.

Approximately eight miles of road have been completed by the men in camp leading into Clear Lake, and weather permitting, the remainder of the 17-mile strip will be completed in the near future.

Work in camp has been slowed up by snow, there being five inches at present. The camp is to be closed during Christmas week, many of the men planning to return to their homes for the holiday. One hundred seventy men are now enrolled.

County School Superintendent Fred Peterson will attend the session, as well as several others in education work in the city and county.

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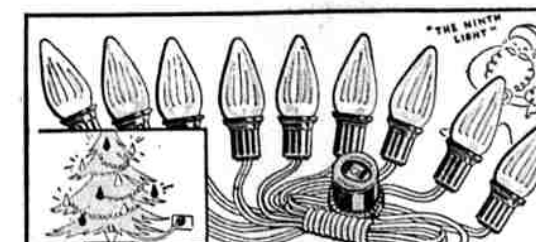
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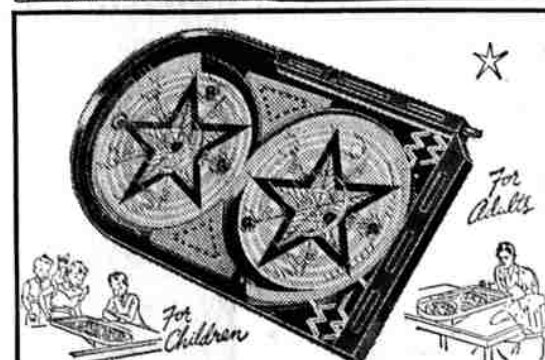


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
