

Soggy Turf Expected for Pasadena Game

WILD MUSTANGS STILL FAVORED

Weather May Decide Outcome of Rose Bowl Classic.

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 31. (AP)—Fair weather, ideal for the New Year's day Pasadena Rose Bowl game, the weather bureau said today.

PASADENA, Dec. 31. (AP)—The weather man may decide who will get the garlands and wear the thorns after the twenty-first Rose Bowl football game here tomorrow.

A soggy turf, the result of a second rain in three days, greeted Stanford and Southern Methodist today as they turned to the Rose Bowl for final workouts in preparation for their intersectional clash.

Mustangs Still Favored
In spite of the possibility of additional moisture and uncertain footing, the pre-game odds remained almost undisturbed at 10 to 8 in favor of Coach Matty Bell's wild charging Mustangs.

Stanford's powerful ground attack, built around Bobby Grayson, all-American fullback, certainly would be less handicapped in the mud than would the lightning thrusts of the Texans featuring Bobby Wilson, the elusive little all-American.

Yet Stanford failed in the rain-drenched bowl here two years ago against a lighter Columbia eleven and the fans haven't forgotten.

Old Losses Recalled
Most observers were inclined to rate the game as a tossup, although Southern Methodist's offensive ability has caught the eyes of the Rose Bowl observers.

Eight members of the Stanford team that will start against the Mustangs tomorrow were members of the eleven that lost to Columbia and Alabama and they are determined to atone for these losses in the last grid clash of their intercollegiate careers.

S. M. U. on the other hand will boldly carry the reputation of the southwest into the game. It is the first time a team from that section ever played in the annual classic and the Mustangs are anxious to make a good impression.

Scrimmage Held Monday
In physical condition the teams will be even, Stanford has James (Mack) Mosier hobbling around with a game knee, but so has Southern Methodist in Harry Shuford.

Each squad polished off with hard dummy scrimmage sessions yesterday. The Mustangs were out early yesterday morning for the secret session at Occidental college while Stanford staged its usual open practice at Brookside park in the afternoon.

Today's drills will be confined to light limbering up exercises and some pass throwing, punting and running on the Rose Bowl turf.

Lipscomb, 161, Indianapolis, won the odd fall and the match when Clingman, 163, Oklahoma city, was counted out.

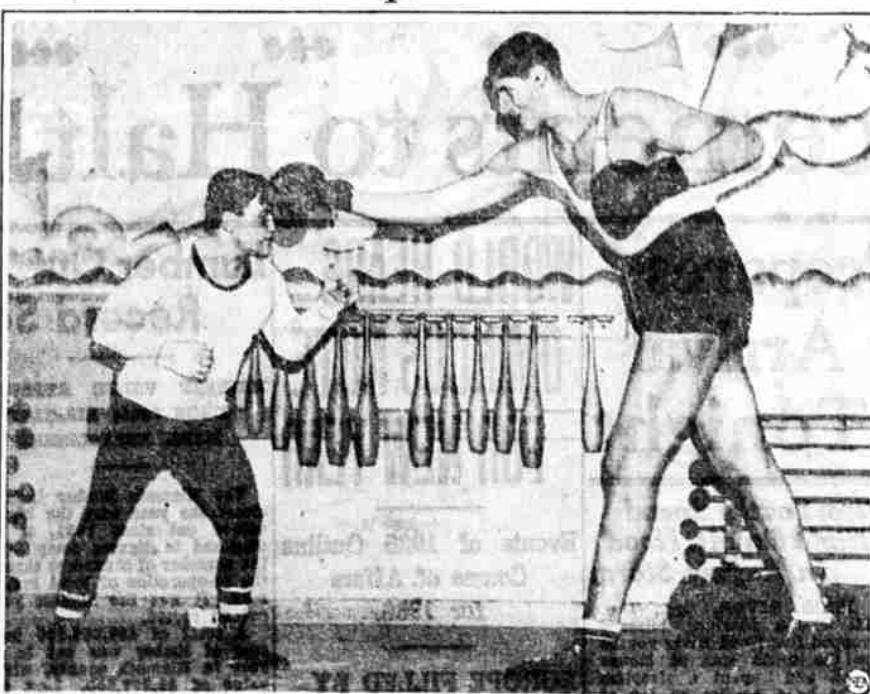
Jack Clayborn, 159, Atlanta, gained a one-fall victory over Bill Zeller, 159, Vancouver, Wash. in 10 minutes.

With 10 teammates, Grayson will sail for Hawaii January 2, to play two football games. The teammates will act as ushers at the wedding.

Beavers Eager For Meeting With Trojans

CORVALLIS, Dec. 31.—Oregon State varsity basketball players will wind up their schedule of seven pre-season games when they meet University of Southern California Trojans at Los Angeles Thursday and Friday nights. Last season the Trojans moved out the Orange men, northern division champions, in the playoff for the Pacific coast conference championship.

Orange players who made the trip to Los Angeles were Wally Palmberg and Cliff Folen, both of Portland; Mud Tuttle, Hoquiam, Wash.; Earling Conkling, Molalla; Bob Bergstrom, Astoria; Art Merryman, Corvallis; Ike Wintermute, Salem; Wilbur Kidder, Pendleton; Sir Howard Watson, Lyman, La Grande, and Chet Kelbbe, Mohler.

The probable starting lineup for the first game against the Trojans will include Palmberg and Tuttle at forward; Conkling at center and Bergstrom and Folen at guard. This is a complete letterman lineup. All these players saw action against the Trojans last season.

So far this season the Orange men have lost only one game in five starts and that to the strong Union Oil team of Portland by the score of 24 to 27. However, the Orange basketballers made up for the lone setback by defeating the Oilers in the other two contests of the three-game series by scores of 35 to 32 and 36 to 25.

In the other pre-season games the Orange men defeated Williamette university by the score of 30 to 29 and Multnomah club of Portland, 39 to 19.

Oregon State will open its conference schedule against University of Idaho here January 19-21.

BEND, Ore., Dec. 31. EASTERN STARS PICKED TO WIN

Brilliant College Players Clash Wednesday in San Francisco.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 31. (AP)—Stars who wrote glorious chapters to wind up their collegiate football careers in 1935 mustered forces today for the "zero hour" of one of the country's gridiron classics—the annual New Year's day game played for charity, and East-West supremacy.

Welded into units as strong and versatile as ten days of intensive coaching can make them, the two squads will battle it out before a crowd expected to nearly tax the 60,000 capacity of the stadium.

Nine Captains Present
The easterners, every one a star during college play, put the finishing touches on the practice program with a zip which clinched the popular belief that Coaches Andy Kerr and Dick Hanley have assembled one of the most formidable squads since the game was established a decade ago.

Nine members of the 22 man group were captains of their team this year. Several crashed into the All America hall of fame, with power as the keynote, a style of play based on the "Warner system," and nine backfield men able to perform well in every behind-the-line line function, the East moves into the game as the 2 to 1 favorite.

West Has Speed
Western hopes will ride on the shoulders of 22 players, unable to match the "headline names" of their eastern rivals, but who will try to keep unbroken a string of victories for the West beginning in 1932.

The thought of losing such performers as Bobby Grayson of Stanford and Bobby Wilson of S. M. U. provided early headaches for the West's coaching staff, Percy Loecey and Orin Hollingsbery.

From the remaining eligibles, they have selected together a team which is expected to outstrip the East in speed. If nothing else, three of the eight western ball carriers, Bill Wallace of Rice Institute, Bill Lam of Colorado and Theron Ward of Idaho, run the 100 yard dash under 19 seconds.

Carter Will Start
Rain threatened to furnish a slippery, soggy field for the game, a factor that was believed would favor the crushing drives of the eastern team and handicap the speed of the western warriors.

The starting lineup for the West includes Carter (Oregon), left guard; Ward (Idaho), quarterback; and Justice (Gonzaga).

Portland Drops Plans For Game
