

PENSION PLAN PARTY FORMS IN CALIFORNIA

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 10. (UP)—Immediate formation of a third party in California was authorized Thursday by Dr. F. E. Townsend, originator of the Townsend pension plan.

In an announcement from state headquarters of the Old Age Revolving Pension, Ltd., Townsend organization, Sheridan Downey was named to direct formation of the party.

EPIC Candidate
Downey was a candidate for lieutenant governor of California at the last state election, running with Upton Sinclair as a democratic-EPIC candidate.

The new party will be called "The Townsend party," according to the announcement.

Downey eventually broke with the straight line "EPIC" forces to rejoin more regular democratic ranks. He polled more than 1,000,000 votes in the state election, and was a powerful spokesman for southern California democratic groups in the state legislature's last session.

Challenge
"Doctor Townsend already has stated publicly that if either of the major parties sincerely adopts his old age plan, the Townsend organization will not run its own candidates in opposition to the party's nominee," Downey commented.

"However, if neither the republican nor democratic parties endorse the Townsend plan we will place our own candidates in the field."

600,000 Members
Downey announced that the estimated 600,000 members of the 1930 various "Townsend clubs" in California would meet January 24 in a statewide "sign-up" campaign.

"We need only about 23,000 signatures to qualify the Townsend party, and we'll get them—and then some—on that one night," he said.

The Townsend sign-up campaign will come at the height of a general political campaign to encourage party followers to register. Under a new state law all voters must re-register this year.

The "goldbeater's skin," used to separate the leaves of metal in goldbeating, is the prepared outside membrane of the large intestine of the ox.

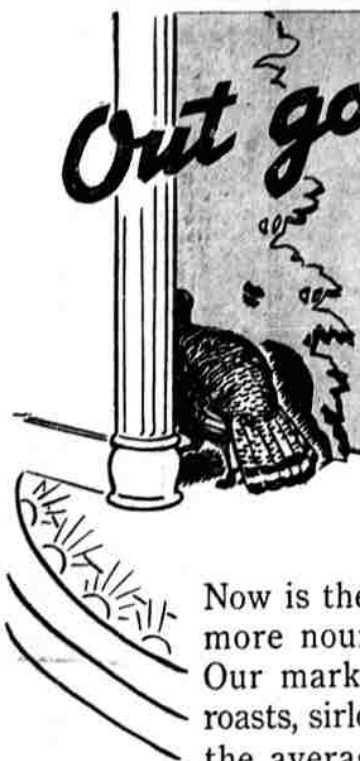
