

ITALY'S LOSS ON SOUTHERN FRONT HEAVY

DESSAYE, Northern Headquarters of the Ethiopian Army, Jan. 10. (AP)—Advances of Italy's war machine was halted by nature on both fronts in Ethiopia Thursday as heavy rains swept Emperor Haile Selassie's rugged kingdom.

Unusual storms, nearly a month ahead of schedule, have proved the Conquering Lion of Judah's most effective ally as Italy's fleet tanks and armored cars, expected to provide the spearheads of simultaneous offensives from the north and south, were bogged in sticky, heavy mud.

Roads Washed Out
Heavy, spasmodic rains along the entire northern front have fallen for the past two weeks, washing out numerous roads, on which thousands of laborers have worked for many months.

The southern front was drenched tonight by a torrential downpour, driving even hardy Ethiopians under shelter. Military operations in that section probably will be halted at least for several days and perhaps longer if the storms prove to be the "small rains" which usually last six weeks.

COAST SAID TO LACK ADEQUATE DEFENSE

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 10. (AP)—The Pacific coast is without a single useful piece of military equipment for defense against an attack by sea, declared Lieut. Col. Frank E. Lowe, national president of the Reserve Officers' association, on a tour of the Pacific northwest.

Construction of land defenses along the Pacific coast is more important than on the Atlantic seaboard, Colonel Lowe said. The army man, making his first trip to this section of the country, from his home in Portland, Me., and Washington, D. C., confessed he was amazed at what he found here.

He declared frankly that the old belief that the Rocky mountains were a natural barrier protecting the middle west and east was out-of-date, and that it

would be "unthinkable" to relinquish all the territory west of the Rockies to an invader.

"The initiative for national defense has passed from the east coast to the west coast," he said. "It is high time that you out here concern yourselves with national defense. You need never fear lack of cooperation from the east."

National defense, he declared, does not mean preparation for war, but maintenance of peace.

Speaking in Portland, Colonel Lowe found himself for the first time on the same program with another national organization leader—Brigadier-General T. E. Rilea, Salem, president of the National Guard association of the

MISSIONARIES TO SHOW PICTURES

Sunday evening at 7:30 o'clock, Mrs. Ernest Moser, missionary in the Cameroon section of West Africa, will present some colored movies of life in Africa. This is the section of the Gold Coast and Ivory Coast made famous by the story of Trader Horn.

Mr. and Mrs. Moser, who are well-known locally, have been located at Kribi on the coast. This is the shipping port through which all freight and supplies pass into the interior, where the Presbyterian Church, U. S. A., have maintained missionary work for many years past. In former years, the average life of the missionary was only two and a half years, but sanitary improvements and protection from insects have materially contributed to the lengthening of human life in this region. Mrs. Moser is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. H. Dunbar, a pioneer family.

The movies will show actual living conditions of the natives and the missionaries, examples of those afflicted with the dread sleeping sickness and other diseases of the tropics. The title of the lecture is "The Words of God in the African Forest."

Those who have seen this picture are enthusiastic in their praises of it. Kribi is located just five degrees north of the equator. The rainfall is measured in feet, not inches.

MANCHOUKUO ARMY ENTERS SINO AREA

PEIPING, Jan. 10. (AP)—Chinese reports reaching here today said Manchoukuo-Mongolian forces had entered eastern Suiyuan Province from Chahar, gaining control of the important railway point of Fengchen and proclaiming an autonomous regime.

The occupation was bloodless, the report said.

Foreigners reaching here today from Kalgan reported the Japanese army was pouring truckloads of armaments into Chinese Inner Mongolia, apparently with the aim of strengthening its position for an early showdown between Manchoukuo and Sovietized outer Mongolia.

FARMERS FAVOR MILK CONTROL

SALEM, Jan. 10. (AP)—The Oregon milk control law found favor with a majority of milk producers, processors and distributors in this section, it was indicated at an all-day hearing before the milk control board yesterday.

Although not altogether favorable general testimony favored continuance of the act.

Some producers believed that retail prices should be increased somewhat due to higher feed prices, but distributors held out for no change, declaring a price increase would inevitably diminish consumption.

Members of the board stated that in recent months there had been less criticism of control and more willingness to accept the principles of state fixing of milk prices.

Similar hearings were scheduled at Corvallis today and Eugene Saturday.

HITLER ILL WITH THROAT TROUBLE

BERLIN, Jan. 10. (AP)—Adolf Hitler's throat trouble, for which he underwent an operation almost a year ago, was reported in diplomatic quarters tonight to be recurring.

Although the propaganda ministry denied it, some sources said Der Fuehrer had undergone a second operation.

Supposedly the operations was performed about Christmas time, and was advanced as one cause of the postponement of the New Year's diplomatic reception until today.
