

## SHIPWRECK INQUIRY STARTS AT ASTORIA

ASTORIA, Ore., Jan. 17, (AP)—Close-hipped investigations were under way today into the freighter shipwreck, which forever sealed the lips of the ship's entire crew of 34 on Peacock spit Sunday.

Coast guard officers from Seattle held a hearing aboard the coast guard cutter Onondaga to determine if life-saving crews at the Columbia river mouth lived up to the rules of the service by rendering every possible aid.

While the report will be confidential to Washington, D. C., headquarters, it was significant that the Onondaga herself was damaged by the battering hurricane in efforts to reach the stricken steamer in Sunday's sudden seas.

It was understood that investigations for the five marine unions in Portland, which announced they would conduct a probe of the disaster, were interviewing seamen and pilots in the lower Columbia area today. Their findings, if significant, are sure to reach public ears.

Federal investigators said they would welcome any information concerning the tragedy, but doubted that evidence could be conclusive because no member of the Iowa's crew lives to testify.

Only six bodies were recovered from the wreck.

## Klamath Students Join Drama Club

## Reprieve of Hauptmann Brings Storm of Protest Against Jersey Governor

TRENTON, N. J., Jan. 17, (UP)—A move to impeach Gov. Harold G. Hoffman probably will be started in the New Jersey general assembly Monday night, a responsible source said last night.

Political opponents of the republican governor are expected to seize on his action in reprieving Bruno Richard Hauptmann, which immediately stirred violent criticism, as a basis for impeachment proceedings.

TRENTON, N. J., Jan. 17, (UP)—An hour after a reprieve was granted to Bruno Richard Hauptmann Thursday, criticism broke around Governor Harold G. Hoffman's head.

Under the black banner headline announcing Hauptmann's reprieve, the Trenton Evening Times ran a first page editorial headed: "Impeach Hoffman."

"Violated Constitution" "Governor Harold G. Hoffman has sacrificed all moral and legal right to serve as chief executive of New Jersey," the editorial read. "He has openly violated the state constitution. He has flaunted the highest courts of state and nation. He has given rise to all manner of suspicion and gossip reflecting upon the cause of good government."

Hoffman is a republican. There have been threats from democrats that they would investigate and perhaps try to impeach the governor if he granted a reprieve. No democrat was willing to assume responsibility tonight for starting impeachment proceedings.

Mandamus Action Urged One prominent democrat pointed out it would be possible for any citizen of New Jersey to go into court and start a mandamus proceeding to try to force Principal Keeper Mark O. Kimberling to carry out the execution tomorrow night.

In that event Kimberling would have to come into court and explain that he had a reprieve from the governor. In that way the court could pass on the legality of the governor's action.

Precedents Hoffman admitted he was acting in the face of a ruling by Attorney General David T. Wilentz that a reprieve was illegal. In event his authority is challenged through a mandamus proceeding, his defense will be that precedents have been established. The law says that the governor lacks power to reprieve a condemned man any time past 90 days after conviction. Hauptmann was convicted at Flemington on February 13, 1935.

Hoffman has before him an enormous mass of data supposed to have bearing on the case. Many of the letters and telegrams already have been investigated

by state police and found to be spurious.

Many of these letters purport to have knowledge of persons other than Hauptmann, who have "confessed" to the Lindbergh crime. Some of them express a desire on the part of the writer to "confess"—but always provided the state of New Jersey will pay railroad fare to Trenton.

Some of the communications Hoffman has received allege: 1. That a Chicago lawyer has a client who knows all about the ransom pay-off.

2. That another Chicago lawyer knows a man who has information that a man named Bruno, a man named John and a woman kidnapped the baby.

Police Investigate 3. That a Wichita, Kan., lawyer knows a man who has information that can be used against some of the state's witnesses at the trial.

4. That a former secret service agent knows that some of the state's witnesses committed perjury.

5. That an ex-agent of the department of justice overheard a gang plotting to kidnap the Lindbergh baby some two days before the crime occurred.

No matter how preposterous a letter or telegram sounds, the state police investigate it. Tonight a high official said he was certain there was no legitimate evidence available now that was not heard at the trial.



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
