Stock Market Quotations

NEW YORK, Jan. 20. (AP)—A few rays of sunshine seeped through the stock market clouds today, but the list, as a whole, displayed few reviving tendencies.

Although some of the aircraft rallied, recent leaders fell back fractionally to a point or more. The close was irregular. Transfers approximated 1,900,000 shares.

Bullish forces appeared to derive some comfort from the fact that the activity dwindled appreciably on the recessionary movement.

News of a stimulating character was lacking and potential buyers seemed content to stand on the sidelines and wait for something to give equities a push in one direction or another.

Commodities were as listless as stocks. Grains and cotton were narrow, generally. Bonds were mixed with various rails pointing lower. The dollar improved in foreign exchange dealings.

Shares of Douglas got up about four points. Gains of fractions to around two points were shown by Boeing, Wright Aeronautical, Curtiss Wright "A", American Woolen, Schenley, American Commercial Alcohol, Hiram Walker and Montgomery Ward. Greyhound Corporation firmed when the directors recommended a split-up in the stock.
