

RETAIL TRADE FEELS EFFECT OF WEATHER

NEW YORK, Jan. 24. (AP)—Retail distribution was affected adversely last week by cold and stormy weather in many areas, but activities in wholesale markets continued to expand. Dun & Bradstreet reported today in their weekly summary of trade conditions.

"With shopping made difficult by the snow and sleet which accompanied the cold wave, the expansion of retail trade was interrupted for the first time this month," it said.

"Attention was diverted suddenly from the January promotional offerings to regular lines of heavy wearing apparel, shoes, galoshes, blankets, winter hard-ware and automobile accessories.

"The estimated volume for the country as a whole was held to a range of 3 to 6 per cent above the comparative 1935 total. In spite of the poorer showing of some of the small cities, the gain for the east ranged from 7 to 10 per cent.

"The weather did not retard buying at wholesale to any extent, as volume for the week made a better comparative showing than that recorded for the retail division.

"Industrial operations were advanced further in a few divisions, but the moderate gain in the schedules of producers of durable goods left the average at about the position occupied a week previous.

"The modest curtailment in the output of automobile parts and supplies has thus far had no influence on foundries and machine shops, which remained active.

"Machine tool orders again increased, with contracts placed further ahead as more price increases became imminent."

EXAMS SCHEDULED FOR U. S. POSITIONS

Open competitive examinations for several positions of a technical nature have been announced by the United States civil service commission, according to word received at the local federal building.

These positions include that of assistant animal fiber technologist, at \$2,600 a year; assistant animal husbandman (sheep breeding), \$2,600 a year; bureau of animal industry, department of agriculture, and that of chief of industrial economist, \$6,500 a year, national labor relations board.

Sleeping Sickness Proves Fatal for Fairport Rancher

ALTURAS, Jan. 24. (Special)—James M. Moore, of Fairport, Cal., who had been in a coma since shortly after Christmas, due to sleeping sickness, died at his home Thursday morning.

Moore ate a hearty dinner Christmas day and immediately became ill. It was thought at first that his illness was caused by indigestion until a physician, called when Moore lapsed into a coma, diagnosed his case as sleeping sickness.

For almost two weeks he seemed to be not entirely unconscious. He could be roused to take nourishment and some times to answer questions.

He grew steadily worse, becoming totally unconscious as to what was being said, although he would swallow food which was placed in his mouth.

Moore was about 35 years old. He was one of 12 men involved in a truck crash three miles west of Alturas last August 2, in which five were instantly killed. Moore received bruises and was badly shaken up.

Art of Bread Making Still Prevalent in Klamath

Do you remember when one day was set aside during the week for mother to do the week's baking? We seldom find this being done now. With the bakery just around the corner it is so easy to skip over there and get a loaf of bread or some rolls. However, when special occasions for entertainment come around the housewife frequently bakes hot yeast rolls or makes quick biscuits or muffins.

We generally find breads classified in two groups: yeast breads and quick breads. To make successful yeast breads always keep in mind the proper conditions necessary for the growth of the yeast plant, that is, proper food, moisture and right temperature. For making quick breads, oven temperature is one of the very important factors.

This week we have some excellent suggestions for new ideas in breads.

Bill-Billy Bread

1 1/2 cups whole wheat or gram flour.
1 1/2 cups white flour.
5 teaspoons baking powder, slightly rounding.

1/2 cup sugar, brown or white.
2 eggs.
Milk enough for medium batter (about 1 1/2 cups).
3 tablespoons melted shortening.

Mix dry ingredients and add milk slowly while stirring; break eggs into batter and beat, then stir in melted shortening. Pour in bread pan and bake slowly. Cool before slicing. Nuts or raisins added to this recipe are delicious. Besides being welcomed on the table as a change by the family, it is also an excellent recipe for an outdoor reflector oven.

New York Maple Muffins

Mrs. Walter Brown

1 cup wheat flour.
1 cup whole wheat flour.
4 level teaspoons baking powder.
1/2 teaspoon salt.

1/2 cup butter or crisco.
2 well beaten eggs.
1/2 cup milk.
1/2 cup maple syrup.

Sift dry ingredients. Cut in butter or crisco. Mix eggs, milk and maple syrup together and add to dry ingredients with a little beating as possible. Bake in oiled muffin pans 20 minutes, oven 400 degrees.

English Saffron Buns

Rt. 2, Box 127B

1 cake compressed yeast.
1 tablespoon sugar.
1 1/2 cups flour.

1/2 cup warm water.
Dissolve yeast and sugar in water and beat well. Let rise 30 minutes, 1/2 box of saffron and shred well, steep in 1 cup hot water. Let cool. Take 1 quart of flour and work in well.

1/2 cup butter. Add 1/2 package of clean currants, 1/4 cup sugar, 1 ounce cut lemon peel, 1 teaspoon salt, 2 beaten eggs. Add saffron tea. Mix well with hands until a sticky dough is formed. Add warm water if more liquid is needed. Let rise in a covered pan twice its size. Shape into buns. Bake until light. Bake 30-40 minutes in medium oven. Makes 2 dozen big buns or 2 1/2 dozen medium sized buns.

Corn Bread With Baking Powder

1 tablespoon butter and 3 tablespoons sugar beaten together; add one egg (well beaten), 2-3 cup of corn meal, 1/2 cup wheat flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, pinch of salt, 1/2 cup sweet milk. Mix all together and bake in a hot oven.

1 cup sugar
1 egg
Pinch salt
1 tablespoon syrup
2 cups sour milk

Jury Must Decide on Darto Legality

SALEM, Jan. 24. (UP)—Attorney General L. H. Van Wyke, asserting that he had never been a "darto" patron personally, said Thursday that determination of whether the element of skill predominates in the game is a fact to be determined by a jury.

Van Winkle's opinion, in answer to district attorneys who had asked him to interpret the law passed by the legislature last year permitting cities to license dart games, said merely that dart games are not lotteries if the element of skill predominates, and that if they are not lotteries they may be licensed.

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EFFECT OF SALES TAX DISCUSSED

The average farmer does not stand in danger of being very badly nicked by the effects of the so-called sales tax in the event of its approval by the voters at the special election on January 31, not nearly so much in fact as his city cousin, according to the way the effect of the act as calculated by the Mersey Tax League of Oregon.

As a unit for calculation, which the individual may apply to his own particular case should he desire to do so, it is pointed out that the farmer who produces and sells taxable commodities would pay a tax of but 12.50 on gross sales of \$100.

However, the law specifies definite exemptions, one of which is the gross income of each person from sales of tangible personal property to the extent of \$50 a month. That would mean a total exemption of gross sales amounting to \$600 during the year. Consequently the farmer who made gross sales of \$1,000 during the year, of taxable commodities, would pay the one quarter of one per cent on but \$400 or a tax of only \$1.

If his gross sales of taxable commodities amounted to \$2,000 his tax for the year would be but \$3.50. Putting in another

way a wheat grower, at the current price for wheat, would have to sell approximately 1,700 bushels of wheat to cause him to pay a tax of \$2.50; with no consideration given to the monthly exemption. Take Ray Gill who is one of the leaders in the attack upon the law for instance, and his seed firm would pay a tax of \$12.50 on gross sales of \$100.

Also, if the farmer produced fresh milk, fruits, vegetables, butter, eggs, cheese or fresh meats, or feed sold to persons producing milk, eggs, wool, fur, meat or other substances obtained from livestock or poultry he would pay no tax upon any of those commodities, for all of those are specifically exempted from the tax by the terms of the act. It would not appear, therefore, that the average farmer would be called upon to add materially to his annual tax bill in order to provide revenue to finance old age security to aged needy persons, to give aid to the blind, to dependent children and the unemployed.
