CHICAGO, Jan. 27, (AP)—Inflation possibilities did a good deal today to make wheat prices average slightly higher.

Wheat closed firm at the same as Saturday's finish to 1 higher, May \$1.01 1/2, corn 1-1/4 off, May 69 1/2, oats also 1-1/4 down, and provisions unchanged to a rise of 5 cents.

House with eastern connection were purchasers on a small scale, and were followed to some extent by millers. Disappointing overseas demand was noted, owing partly to closing of Liverpool and Winnipeg exchanges tomorrow for King George's funeral.

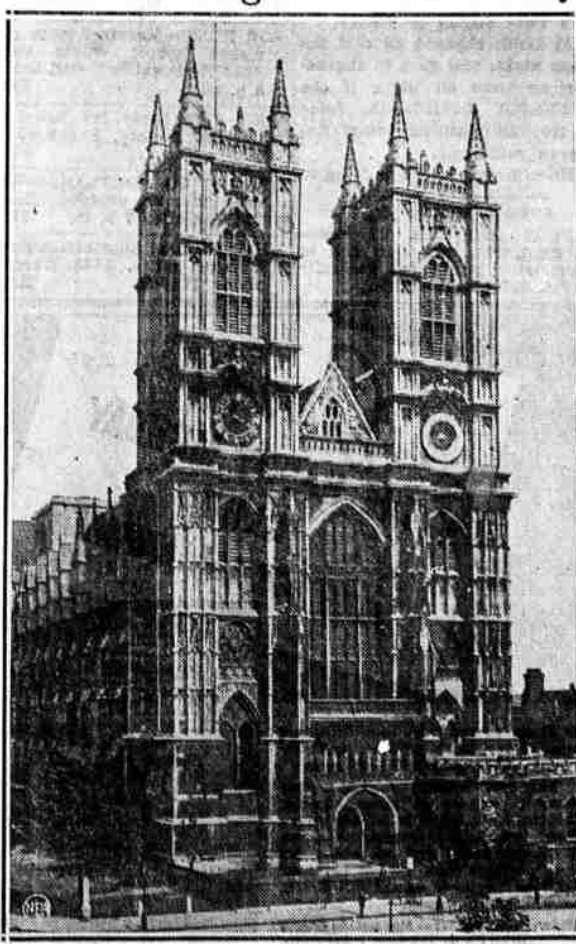

Stock Market Quotations

NEW YORK, Jan. 27, (AP)—The stock market apparently experienced a few more inflationary twinges today and prices pushed up fractions to a point or more. There was considerable profit taking near the finish.

A fast buying flurry followed the senate's repassage of the soldiers' bonus bill over the president's veto. The pace slowed later. The close was firm. Transfers approximated \$1,000,000 shares.

Leadership rotated between the aircrafts, oils, rails, industrial specialties and secondary utilities. There was a steady upward movement from the opening, but the momentum was increased at the beginning of the final hour and the ticker tape fell behind floor transactions for a time.

The senate's bonus vote was in line with Wall Street's forecasts, but broken said new buying appeared when payment to the veterans was finally assured
