

MAHONEY SPEAKER AT MALIN MEETING

MERRILL, Ore.—Indicative of the growing interest in the Townsend plan, more than 100 members of the newly organized Townsend club here heard Willie Mahoney, mayor of Klamath Falls, discuss the feasibility of the plan Tuesday night.

Mahoney, recently returned from a speaking tour which included North Bend, and other towns in the western part of the state, stated that interest is steadily increasing in the issue, with hundreds of persons turning out for Townsend talks.

More than one-sixth of the population of the United States is still on relief, Mahoney stated, making a total of 22,000,000. Of this number, 12,000,000 are unemployed, and more than 7,000,000 are children under 16 years of age.

The only solution is a revolution of financial balance, he told his audience.

Reading from government statistics, he stated that following a government survey, statisticians say that to live comfortably, each American family should realize a yearly income of \$4370.

Mahoney was introduced by O. H. Bronson, president of the club.

A few brief remarks were made on the subject by Frank Mortenson, Klamath Falls, at the close of the session.

MALIN MINISTER TO SPEAK HERE

Dr. R. M. Stevenson, who has been located temporarily at Malin since the beginning of the year, is to be the speaker at the First Presbyterian church Sunday evening at 7:30 o'clock. His topic will be "Among the Head-Hunters of the South Sea."

From there he came to Malin.

Recently Dr. Stevenson spoke before the Twenty-Thirdians. The various other service clubs expect to have the privilege of hearing him also.

It was in 1901 that James Chalmers, the celebrated missionary to New Guinea, was stricken down by a cannibal's club. Dr. Stevenson was the first regular missionary to succeed Dr. Chalmers. He has worked in the Fiji Island group also.

It is interesting to note that Dr. Stevenson is a second cousin of Robert Louis Stevenson. In fact, it was his father that introduced the woman that became his wife to Robert Louis Stevenson.

Dr. Stevenson is an interesting speaker, and out of his wide experience as a world-wide traveler he has many interesting incidents and stories that are thrilling, as well as photographs of cannibal feasts and the sacred stone used in the Fijis for sacrificing human beings, now used as a baptismal font.

The general public is cordially invited to hear this interesting lecture.

Woman Discloses Husband's Murder Year After Death

PORT ORCHARD, Wash., Feb. 13, (U.P.)—Mrs. Adolph Sandell, middle-aged Port Orchard housewife, revealing the secret she has kept for nearly a year, Wednesday told Kitsap county sheriff's deputies that her ex-husband, Adolph Sandell, 50, was murdered and cremated near here last May 21.

She said her ex-husband was killed when Sandell, herself, and a man whose name she refused to divulge were burning stumps at a lonely clearing two and a half miles south of Port Orchard.

Sandell and the man had a violent argument, and from across the clearing where she was working she saw the man shoot her ex-husband, then toss his body on a pile of burning stumps, according to her story.

The man buried the remains in a nine-foot grave, she told officers, and threatened to kill her if she ever revealed the crime.

After hearing the story, officers arrested Lawson K. Barton, 50, retired navy machinist's mate of Port Orchard, and his brother, Joshua L. Barton, in a cabin near East Stanwood, Wash., and held them for questioning in the Kitsap county jail.

The Bartons are believed to be half-brothers of Sandell, who returned to Mrs. Sandell, his divorced wife, two and a half months before the asserted murder.
