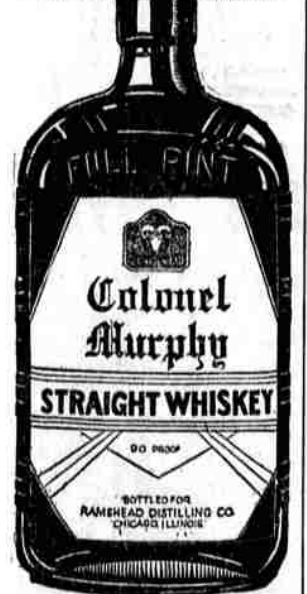
Mrs. Chase Ill—Mrs. Vera Chase, assistant in the district attorney's office, has been confined to her home with illness this week.
