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JULY, SEPTEMBER WHEAT ON INCREASE

CHICAGO, Feb. 25, (AP)—Becoming wheat trade leaders for the first time this season, the new crop months of July and September rose more than a cent a bushel today.

With the annual crop scare period at hand, report of dust storms in winter crop territory southwest received greater notice. There was also talk that legislation would be enacted to control spring wheat seeding in the northwest.

Wheat closed firm at the same as yesterday's finish to one cent higher, May, 99c to 99 1/2c; July, 90c to 90 1/2c; corn 1c off to 1c up, May 60c; oats at 1c decline to 1c advance, and provisions varying from 17c setback to a rise of 2 cents.
