

SURVEY SHOWS TRADE RESUMES BETTER TREND,

NEW YORK, Feb. 28. (AP)—With the weather handicap considerably eased, business and trade moved in better volume the past week, Dun & Bradstreet reported today in their weekly summary of trade conditions.

The rebound in retail distribution was especially strong, it was stated, "an fulfillment of postponed needs built up the best volume in three weeks."

In wholesale brackets also, the summary said, activity developed under the pressure of deferred commitments for spring merchandise and reorders for freshening of current stocks. And with the flow of both raw materials and shipments less impeded, improvement extended to most industrial divisions.

"Rising to the best volume in three weeks, retail sales expanded steadily, as milder weather provided more comfortable shopping conditions."

The first extended break in the field weather in more than a month enabled most of the cities to report larger retail sales than for the week preceding. In some instances the gains ran as high as 15 to 20 per cent.

"Staples dominated the orders from many districts as renewed interest was accorded dry goods, printed silk fabrics, chinaware, curtains and house furnishings."

Gale Breaks Anchor Chain of Lightship

ASTORIA, Ore., Feb. 28. (AP)—The lightship Columbia rode out a 90-mile hurricane which snapped her anchor chain and drove mountainous seas over her pilot house, in maintaining a guiding light near the Columbia river entrance Wednesday night, Captain Jacob Neilson said Thursday.

The southwest wind broke the Columbia's anchor chain at 4 p. m. Wednesday and forced the vessel 15 miles off its position. Backing a wind that ranged from 50 to 100 miles an hour and huge waves, the Columbia barely held the new position throughout the night, warning all vessels by radio of the change.

Riots Flare in Rumania's Capital City

BUCHAREST, Rumania, Feb. 27. (AP)—More than 50 persons were wounded when police fired on communists and socialists following widespread rioting Thursday.

Radical demonstrations started this morning as a protest against the prosecution's actions in the trial of Anna Pavlov and other communists charged with treason.

During the afternoon the rioting became general.

Protest Against Lupescu
Police reinforcements, after vain efforts to quell the crowds with batons, finally fired several volleys.

The demonstrations were directed in part against Magda Lupescu, red-haired Jewess who has become notorious as the mistress of King Carol II.

Armored cars were called out shortly before midnight, and rumbled grimly through the streets, bristling with machine guns. Police said, however, they were brought out merely as a "precaution" and that it was not likely the machine guns would be used.

None Seriously Hurt
Crowds paraded through many of the principal thoroughfares shouting imprecations at the government.

Groups from both the left and right wing radical parties were participating in the demonstrations and police feared they would begin fighting each other. Nationalists started counter-demonstrations shouting: "Down with Moscow. Down with Lupescu. Down with the Jews."

None of those wounded was hurt seriously.

State Communists May Revive Party

SALEM, Feb. 28. (AP)—The communist party, which was wiped off Oregon records in 1932 when it failed to poll 5 per cent of the congressional vote, will be revived by petition for this year's election, it was said Thursday by Irvin Goodman, Portland attorney.

Petitions signed by 14,679 persons must be filed with the secretary of state, and certification of nomination of candidates must be presented before September 18 to assure a ballot place for the party in November.

WILSON AIDE DIES
GALLATIN, Mo., Feb. 28. (AP)—Joshua W. Alexander, 84, war-time secretary of commerce in the Woodrow Wilson cabinet, died Thursday of old age. Mrs. Alexander and three daughters and two sons were at his bedside. Alexander has been ill for several weeks.

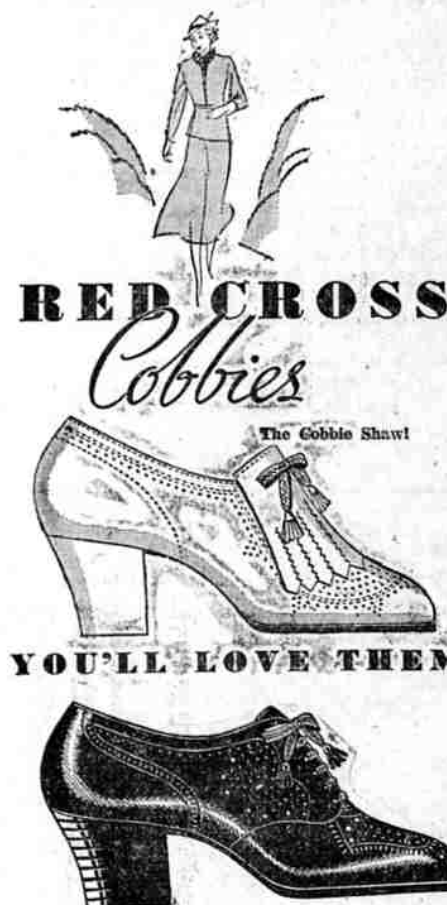
