

GARBAGE DUMPING RULES ANNOUNCED

Police Judge Clifton Richmond on Thursday called attention to the location of the new city dump ground, and the regulations for its use. He said that since changes have been made, many residents are not informed about this matter.

The dump is located about 1 1/2 miles out on the Old Fort Klamath road, beyond the Main street bridge.

The public is permitted to dump refuse there on week days between 1:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. On Sundays and holidays the hours are from 7:00 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. Garbage must be dumped at the same place where similar material is being deposited by the garbage collection service.

Water Elevation in Tulelake Sump Reaches Record Mark

Elevation of water in the Tulelake sump is 4033.77 feet at present, a higher level than any recorded this year to date, B. E. Hayden, superintendent of the Klamath reclamation project stated Wednesday.

At the time of the last dike break which occurred in the late fall, water elevation stood at 4034.40, just .63 of a foot higher than the present mark.

The bureau of reclamation is turning the entire flow of Lost river down the diversion canal to keep it from flowing into the already full Tule lake sump. Approximately 400 second feet of water are going down the diversion canal daily, while at the peak of the recent rains a maximum of 1100 second feet was diverted from the river. This heavy flow continued, however, for only three days.

Lake of Water

A virtual lake of seepage water has accumulated on the southern side of the dike, on the Liskey holdings, which was kept intact last fall when other dikes went out. Liskey brothers are pumping this water out at present onto drier lands to the south.

Much of the land in the sump area is already saturated with water, and little will need to be pumped out for irrigation, which adds to the hazard of conditions now existing.

The sump will be increased by approximately 2,500 acres, however, when the new leases are given next year, Hayden stated. According to present plans,

the United States biological survey is proposing to furnish between \$12,000 and \$18,000 for the construction of a new dike extending from the high point on the Great Northern tracks, west to what is locally known as Willow point at the Lava beds, or a distance of one and a half miles. The bureau of reclamation will construct the dike when the funds are allocated by the U. S. B. S., Hayden stated. It is expected that construction of this project will begin in the early summer.

In conjunction with the dike project, a road is being built at present by CCC boys under the direction of Superintendent C. W. Fensler. This road begins at a point on the Dallas-California highway two miles below Stronghold, skirts the east side of the peninsula, and crosses the peninsula to Petricliff. From there it extends southwest to the Great Northern tracks where the proposed dike will begin.

The road will continue across the dike when it is completed and the top gravelled, Hayden stated. This highway will afford a new entrance to the Lava Beds national monument at Willow point.

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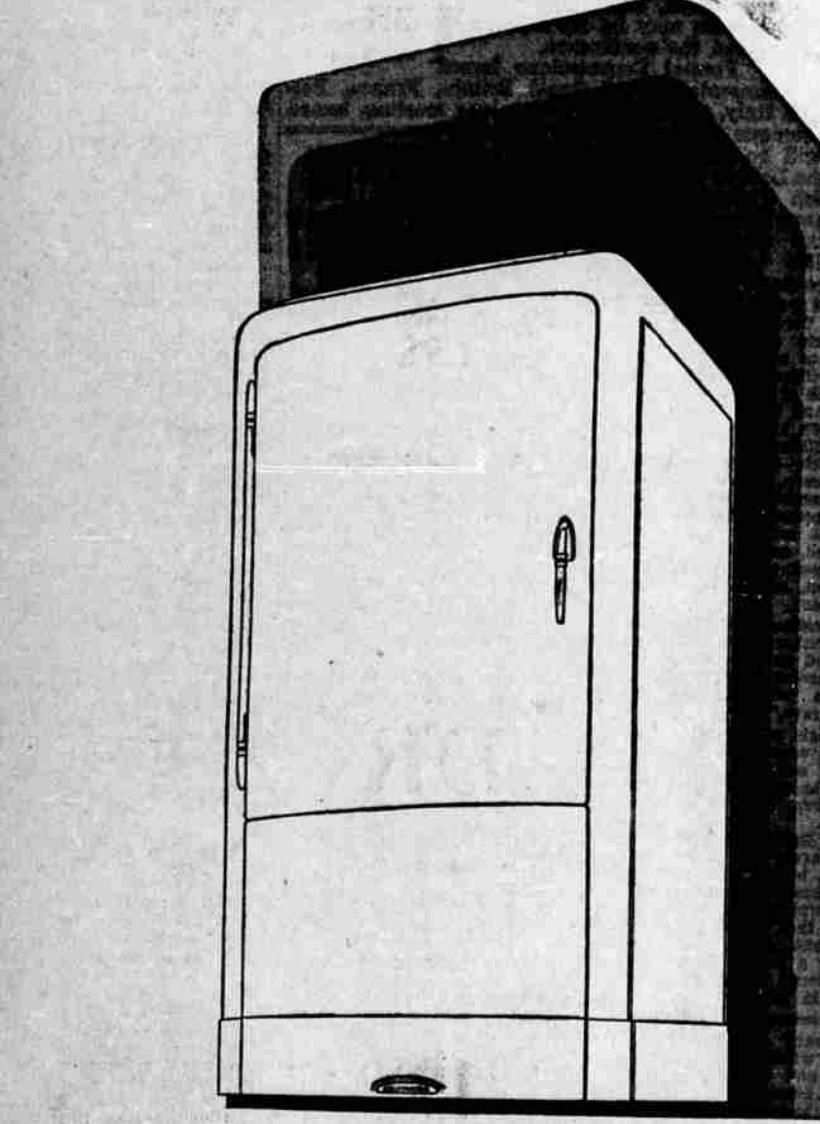
