

## Many Delicious Dishes Made From Rice Recipes

Rice is a food which serves sometimes as a main dish and sometimes as a dessert. It can easily be "dressed up" in one way or another. Frequently it is the disguise that makes rice such a delicious dish. Nutrition experiments have proven that unpolished rice is more healthful than the polished variety. However, we are living today in a world of refined foods therefore we like the white rice and not brown rice.

Honey, Rice, and Date Pudding  
2 cups cooked rice  
2 lightly beaten eggs  
1-3 to 4 cup honey  
4 cup chopped dates  
1 cup milk

Mix eggs with milk. Put alternate layers of rice and dates into a buttered baking dish. Drizzle honey over each layer; then pour the egg mixture over this. (This forms a custard). Bake in moderate oven 45 minutes.

Rice Temptation  
1 cup white rice  
3 teaspoons salt  
2 quarts boiling water.  
Cook rice for fifteen minutes, or until tender. (Test by crushing a grain between fingers.) Drain, but do not rinse. Spread over surface of shallow pan to thickness of one inch. Press down firmly with hands. Cut with cookie or biscuit cutter.

Place the round cuts on buttered cookie sheet and dot each round with butter. Brown quickly under broiler or in a very hot oven.

These are especially good served with creamed chicken or creamed codfish or try them for breakfast with hot maple syrup.  
Note: Left-over rice may be used up in this way.

Mexican Rice Timbales  
Wash and drain 2 cups of raw rice. In skillet brown rice in 2 tablespoons butter. Place in top of double boiler, add small amount of water and steam until rice is tender. Add 1 tablespoon chopped onion, seasonings. Pack into buttered custard cups. Melt 1 package of Creamed Old English cheese in double boiler. Add 1-3 cup evaporated milk gradually, stirring. Unmold rice timbales on platter, pour hot cheese sauce over each. Serve with asparagus garnished with pimientos.

Rice Muffins  
1 cup flour  
1 cup boiled rice  
3 teaspoons baking powder  
1 tablespoon sugar  
1 teaspoon salt  
2-3 cup milk  
1 egg.

Sift together flour, baking powder, sugar, and salt. Then add milk, melted shortening, and well beaten egg. Add the rice

and mix well. Half fill greased muffin tins and bake in moderate oven for 20 minutes.

Rice Waffles  
1 tablespoon Wesson oil  
1 1/2 cups flour  
2-3 cup cooked rice  
2 tablespoons sugar  
4 teaspoons baking powder  
1 1/2 cups milk  
1 egg  
1 teaspoon salt  
Mix and sift dry ingredients. Work in rice with finger tips. Add milk, yolk of egg well beaten, Wesson oil, and white of egg beaten stiff.

Rice "Spanish"  
1-3 cup shortening  
1 clove garlic (mince)  
1 cup sliced onions  
1 pound ground beef  
1 green pepper, chopped fine  
1 cup diced celery  
2 1/2 cups tomatoes and juice  
2 teaspoons salt  
1/2 teaspoon pepper  
2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce.

1 cup rice (wash and dry). Melt fat, wash garlic and onion slightly, add meat and brown. Add pepper, celery, tomatoes and salt. Cover and cook until steaming. Stir mixture and sprinkle rice on top. Do not stir after adding rice. Cover and cook in oven 1 hour—350°.

3 eggs  
1 1/2 cups cold boiled rice  
1 teaspoon butter  
1 cup India corn meal  
1/2 cup flour  
2 teaspoons baking powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
Mix in order named and bake in crumpet rings on hot greased griddle.

Daisy Rice  
1 1/2 cups rice  
1 small onion  
4 carrots (more if possible)  
1 length of spiro ribs  
White pepper, salt, and butter.  
Cook spiro ribs in salted water until tender. Lift out; add rice and chopped onion. Cook until done, chop carrots fine, cook in salted water in a separate pan. When done heap in the center of a platter and season with a little white pepper and butter to taste, while hot. Place rice around the carrots and lastly the spiro ribs with a few sprigs of parsley.

The following facts are worthy of your consideration. Fifty-one million cases of food were canned on the Pacific coast in 1934. Ninety per cent of this merchandise (or 45 million cases) was packed and shipped in fibre containers. If the total amount of canned food (51 million cases) had been shipped in wooden boxes, it would have increased the consumption of box materials 184 million feet and increased the payroll of lumber and box factories 664 thousand dollars. A portion of this money would have been spent right here in Klamath Falls bringing additional prosperity to the entire Klamath Basin.

The lumber and box factories of Klamath Falls need your support to make the present wooden box campaign a success. Lumber companies, both large and small, operated the last few years at a loss.
