

# SPRING BOOSTS RETAIL TRADE IN PAST WEEK

NEW YORK, March 13. (AP)—Active buying for spring goods boosted the past week's retail trade volume to the highest levels witnessed since the start of the year. Dun & Bradstreet said today in their weekly summary of business conditions.

Activity in wholesale markets was reported "in consonance" with the higher geared retail rate, and pressure of orders slowed deliveries. Industrial operations were described as keyed for fresh advances in the second quarter.

"In spite of the vagaries of the March weather," said the review, "all of the leading cities reported retail sales larger than for the week preceding. Increases running as high as 30 to 40 per cent in some instances." This lifted the estimated average of retail sales for the country to a range of 10 to 15 per cent more than for the corresponding 1935 week.

"The best week thus far this year was reported by most wholesale branches, as mail orders from country districts were nearly double those received last week, and road salesmen contrib-

uted the largest volume of business since last fall.

"Although orders for dry goods were somewhat larger than a week earlier, the market generally was quiet. Orders for towels, bedspreads, curtains and upholstery fabrics increased, and mail requests were more numerous for sheets and cases.

# SCHOOL FIGURES SHOWS INCREASE

Enrollment in elementary schools of Klamath Falls shows a slight gain over last year, according to Superintendent J. P. Wells. The total registration on March 1, 1936, showed 2,494 students, against the total of 2,417 last year.

Comparisons of enrollment totals in individual schools were listed on March 1 as follows: Fairview school, 296 in 1935, and 293 in 1936; Fremont school, 1935, 414, and 1936, 454; Canner school, last year, 136, and this year, 156; Mills school, last year, 762, this year, 773; Pelican school, last year, 196, this year, 174; Riverside school, last year, 221, this year, 250; Roosevelt school, last year, 393, this year, 394.

# PINE PRODUCTION SHOWS INCREASE

PORTLAND, Ore., March 13. (AP)—New lumber business of 111 mills in the Western Pine association for the week ending March 7 was nine per cent greater than for the preceding week, the association reported today.

The mills reported 52,670,000 feet, shipments of 48,199,000 feet and production of 35,711,000 feet.

For the corresponding week a year ago the same mills showed orders 57,429,000 feet and production 32,320,000 feet. So far this year orders are four per cent above the corresponding period last year.

The Romilly Boy Singers, direct from Wales, who have sang before King George V and Queen Mary, as well as before many famous statesmen such as Ramsay MacDonald and Lloyd George, are to be at the First Presbyterian church this coming Tuesday evening, March 17, appearing at 8:00.

The choir has a large and varied repertoire, consisting of classical and popular choruses, part songs, glee, folk songs, sea chanties, quartettes, and instrumental numbers. Their conductor is Dr. W. M. Williams.

Their singing has been highly enjoyed by such eminent musicians as Sir Walford Davies, Sir Richard Terry, Sir Ivor Atkins, Dr. David Evans, Prof. Granville Bantock, Dr. Hopkins Evans, Sir Henry Coward, and Julius Harrison, Esq. They are under the management of Mr. Victor Desautels of Montreal.

These boy singers have been winners of the first Grand Prix at the Paris International Music Festival, first winners on three occasions at the Royal National

Estabod of Wales, of the Festival of Empire Concerts, Crystal Palace, Wembley Exhibition Concerts, first prize, Mid-Wales, Llandrindod, first prize, Bristol, first prize, Bournemouth.

Sir Henry Coward, celebrated musician and director, says, "They are as near perfection as they could possibly be."

This country must have been pretty well parched when the rains returned after that epochal absence.

IT IS evident, of course, that the lakes of this high inland country must have been alternately empty and full many times in the centuries that have passed since that much farther distant time when this was a great inland sea—an arm of the mighty Pacific.
