SETBACKS OCCUR ON WHEAT MART

CHICAGO, March 16. (AP)—Sufficient selling developed in the wheat pit today to give at times a cent a bushel setback to values.

Buyers were deterred because of uncertainties regarding the Franco-German deadlock. There was also a prevalent disposition to believe moisture southwest would yet prove ample for domestic wheat crops.

Wheat closed unsteady, 3/4-1/2 cent below Saturday's finish, May 99-1/2, July 98-1/2, corn 34-1/2, oats 14-1/2, and provisions unchanged to 12 cents decline.

Stock Market Quotations

NEW YORK, March 16. (AP)—Steel stocks, along with a few utilities and air transports, correlated what little support made its appearance in today's market.

Although there were scattered gains of fractions to a point or more, profit-taking in various industrial specialties loosened these for declines of as much. The late tone was irregular. Transfers approximated 2,100,000 shares.

For the most part the list lacked vigor throughout, despite industrial news that was interpreted as constructive. The failure of Saturday's rally to follow through caused some traders to adjourn to the sidelines.

The steel reflected the official estimate of the American Iron and Steel Institute that current mill operations were at 60 per cent of capacity, compared with 55.8 per cent last year. The latest figure was the highest since the institute started to make weekly estimates, in November, 1933. National Steel also reported 1935 earnings of \$5.16 a share against \$2.80 in 1934.

Bonds were mixed, as were commodities, the dollar was about steady in terms of leading foreign currencies.
