

BAKERY PLANNING GALA OPEN HOUSE

After months of remodeling and preparation, Fluhrer's new bakery will hold a gala open house at their plant at 121 North Seventh street tomorrow. Elaborate preparations have been made to entertain and instruct Klamath residents, who wish to visit the plant.

Spring flower corsages for the ladies, and old-fashioned penny scrambles for the kiddies are planned. Large decorated cakes which will be awarded each hour, free coffee and cake are but a few of the features of the event.

Employees of the concern will be on hand to conduct visitors through the bakery on a tour of inspection and explain to them the workings of the various types of equipment and methods of modern bread baking. A demonstration of cake decorating will also be given by Charles Lamont, one of the employees of the firm. Fluhrer's bakery was purchased by Fluhrer Bakeries, Inc., from

Charles A. Landis last fall. Landis founded the bakery here in 1923 and built the present bakery in 1930. Since purchasing the bakery, Fluhrer, who heads the company, has completely renovated the plant and added a great deal of new equipment at a cost of several thousand dollars. It is said that the new plant is one of the finest bakeries of its size on the Pacific coast.

Fluhrer Bakeries, Inc., is an Oregon corporation which distributes its products throughout southern Oregon and northern California through three bakeries located at Medford, Yreka, Calif., and Klamath Falls. It is the largest bakery operation in the state outside the city of Portland. The combined payroll of the various plants totals over 75 employees.

A full line of breads, cakes and cookies are marketed under the Fluhrer label. The complete line of breads will be offered to the Klamath territory for the first time tomorrow.

Red Cross Here Gets Plea to Aid In Flood Relief

Klamath county chapter of the American Red Cross received Thursday night from San Francisco headquarters an urgent request to contribute to the relief of flood sufferers in the stricken eastern states area.

The plea, wired here, read as follows:

"Glen Hout, chairman Klamath county chapter American Red Cross. "Reports received late tonight indicate 38,000 thousand families in 11 states driven from their homes in flooded area. This number is expected to increase. These people all looking to Red Cross for immediate relief including shelter, food, clothing, medical care. Minimum relief funds of \$3,000,000 necessary provide care for the flood victims for indefinite period until they can return to their homes. Please take immediate action raise your chapter quota of \$350 in behalf these disaster stricken families. Feel confident people your community will wish to give promptly and generously. Remittances should be forwarded to Pacific branch headquarters as promptly as possible. Report progress at least twice each week."

Hout said that efforts would be made to raise the Klamath quota. He hoped "everyone would consider the matter seriously and contribute liberally to the relief of these distressed people."

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
