GRAIN MARKET SHOWS STRENGTH

CHICAGO, March 30. (AP)—Commodity house buying of May wheat against sales of July mixed matters somewhat in late trading today, but the market as a whole showed strength.

Kansas City new crop deliveries of wheat displayed stubborn resistance to small dips here. Liverpool wheat also tended upward, closing 1-1 cent higher with sterling advanced a point.

Wheat closed firm, unchanged to 1/2 cent higher compared with Saturday's finish, May 97-97 1/2, July 87 1/2-87 1/2, corn 1-1 up, May 60 1/2-60 1/2, oats 1/2 advanced, and provisions varying from 2 cents decline to an equal gain.

Stock Market Quotations

NEW YORK, March 30. (AP)—Demand for a few specialties, some of which managed to hold gains of 1 to around 2 points, today kept the stock market on a fairly even keel.

While the close was steady, it was the dullest full session in six months. Transfers approximated only 800,000 shares.

Brokers said, although domestic news was generally interpreted as constructive, and the foreign situation appeared to be much less threatening, many traders felt their seats on the sidelines were sufficiently comfortable for the time being.

On the optimistic side was the estimate of the American Iron & Steel Institute that current steel mill operations were at 62 per cent of capacity compared with 53.7 in the preceding week.

Shares of J. I. Case reached a new 5-year high in the morning with a jump of 6 points, but fell back later. Midland Steel products got up more than 2, and gainers got up around a point included Sharon Steel, Auburn, Simmons Co., Bendix, Waukesha Motors, American Crystal Sugar, Deere, International Harvester, American Smelting and Cerro de Pasco.

The majority of the railroads, utilities and motors marked time. Johns-Manville, Douglas and Seaboard oil were lower.
