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National and Local Markets

OREGON'S BUTTER OUTPUT SURVEYED

SALEM, April 2. (AP)—Creameries of the state of Oregon manufactured 29,836,203 pounds of butter during 1935, the annual dairy products report issued by the agricultural department issued today showed.

Creameries listed totaled 104, while 23,998 patrons furnished the cream for the manufacturing. Cheese manufactured in the state during the same period totaled 16,387,558 pounds by the 50 cheese factories. Milk was furnished by 3,072 farmers. The condensed milk industry in the state likewise showed favorable records compared to previous years, the department announced. A total of 26,189,444 pounds of condensed milk was manufactured by 12 plants. They also put out 5,125,549 pounds of powdered milk and 47,719 pounds of powdered buttermilk.

Ice cream manufactured by 84 factories was 1,429,199 gallons and cheese manufactured by 23 plants was 1,420,846 pounds.
