

RELIEF DONATIONS STILL COMING IN

Contributions for relief of flood victims in the east still pouring in according to George Walton, secretary of the Klamath county chapter of the American National Red Cross.

Some of the schools have asked their pupils to make donations of any amount from one penny up, and a certain little boy at Fairhaven school marched in the other day with a whole dollar. He said he wanted to give that much, since he and his family had been in a flood once, and that the Red Cross helped them a lot when everything was pretty bad.

Fairhaven school's contribution amounted to \$6.12. Klamath Union high school sent in a contribution of \$13.10; the Disabled War Veterans of Klamath Falls gave \$10, the Eagles lodge \$15, and other donations have been received for flood relief work during the past few days from the following sources: Moe's store, Police Judge Clifton Richmond, Mrs. F. W. Abbey, Jimmie Floyd, Howard Barnhisel and Leah Collins.

A welcome contribution consisting of a number of layettes to the local Red Cross chapter, was given this week by a Wednesday club of St. Paul's Episcopal church. The local Red Cross is in constant need of baby clothes, and was very glad to receive this contribution, according to Walton.

Austrians Fight Arms Smuggling For Nazi Putsch

VIENNA, April 8. (UP)—Austria rushed troops to her German and Czechoslovakian frontiers Tuesday to halt smuggling of German arms into Austria, presumably for an armed Nazi putsch.

Simultaneously, Premier Benito Mussolini of Italy renewed his pledge of military assistance to Austria in event of a Nazi attack.

A large shipment of arms destined for Hungary, was seized by Austrian border guards at Lina last night.

Money also is being brought into Austria to finance renewed Nazi propaganda against the government, it was charged.

LOCKE HAS SALES RECORD IN MARCH

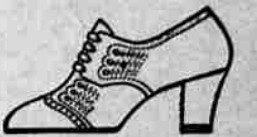
