

THREE CITY BILLS TO GO ON BALLOT

Final passage of ordinances calling for election on three city charter amendments is scheduled for action by the city council Monday evening. The amendments will be voted upon at the primaries on May 15.

If the three measures are passed, as seems probable, the ordinances will be run the required number of times as legal advertisements in order that voters may become acquainted with the different provisions. The law requires that two publications in the official newspaper be made within the 15 days immediately preceding election.

Salary Boost for Treasurer

Ballot titles of the three charter amendments will appear as follows: To amend the charter of the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon by amending Section 207 thereof as the said section heretofore has been amended, so that it will read as follows:

"Section 207. The treasurer shall receive an annual salary of sixteen hundred twenty dollars (\$1620.00), payable monthly, out of the general fund in the same manner as other salaries are paid; that said sum shall be in lieu, and in full payment of all salary, emolument or compensation whatsoever of said treasurer; the city treasurer shall give a bond of some reliable surety company in a sum to be determined by the council, which bond shall be approved by the mayor."

To amend the charter of the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon, by amending Section 186 thereof, as the said section has heretofore been amended so that it will read as follows:

"Section 186. The said park commissioners at any regular meeting thereof shall have power to assess a tax not exceeding one mill on the dollar in any one year upon the taxable property of the city, which tax shall be collected as are other city taxes, and when so collected shall be exclusively used for park purposes according to their judgment; and the said park commissioners shall have further and exclusive control of all parks within the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon, owned or operated by it, and shall have such power to lay out and improve such park or parks; to appoint all necessary managers, supervisors and other employees, including the police force, to act in such park or parks, and to fix the amount of their compensation; and shall disburse all moneys appropriated, given, received or collected for the improvement and use of said park or parks; and shall make all necessary rules and regulations for the use or government of such park or parks, and for breaches of such rules and regulations, to affix penalties not to exceed a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00), and not to exceed fifty (50) days imprisonment, or both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court, such fines to be collected and penalties imposed, as other fines and penalties are imposed by the charter and ordinances of said city; that the police judge shall have jurisdiction of all offenses denounced by this section."

To amend the charter of the city of Klamath Falls by adding thereto chapter 8 authorizing the common council to levy and collect a tax of 0.4 mill (four tenths of a mill) upon each dollar of all the taxable property in the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon, each year, beginning with the tax levy to be made in 1936, for the support, maintenance, pay and equipment of a band of music to be known as the Klamath Falls Municipal Band; creating a special fund of said city to be known as the Klamath Falls Municipal Band fund, and providing that all funds derived from the tax levies herein provided for shall be covered into such fund; repealing all tax limitations contained in said charter insofar as said levy is concerned."

Advertising Club Lines up Against Beauty Shop Act

Unfavorable reaction to an ordinance now before the city council forbidding price advertising by beauty operators was crystallized Saturday in a resolution adopted by the Klamath Falls Ad club.

The ad men placed themselves on record as opposed to the proposed ordinance and condemned it as "unfair, a restraint on fair competition and dangerous."

Text of the resolution:

"To the city council of Klamath Falls, Oregon:
"At a regular meeting of the Advertising Club of Klamath Falls, an organization affiliated with the Pacific Coast association of Advertising Clubs, Tuesday, April 7, the following resolution was offered and unanimously adopted:

"Whereas, it is contrary to the principles of this organization that any ordinance, law or act should be passed which will limit or restrain any person, person or place of business from speaking through the paid columns of newspapers, by paid time over radios or by any other commonly accepted method of advertising used to truthfully inform the public of the merits or prices of any legitimate service or article of merchandise;

"And whereas we believe that the public has the right to be informed regarding the prices or merits of any service or merchandise which is offered for consumption before entering a place of business to purchase same;

"THEREFORE, this organization places itself on record as opposed to the proposed ordinance which is now before the council of the city, proposing to prohibit beauty parlors from advertising prices charged for services, and condemns it as unfair, a restraint on fair competition and as establishing a dangerous precedent;

GRANGE HOLDS MEETING AT LOST RIVER

Laying of groundwork for the Pomona grange meeting to be held at Mallin, May 9 and election of officers in their own organization occupied some 70 members of the Klamath county grange council, meeting Saturday in the Lost River grange hall at Olene.

Amos Slack of Bonanza was elected president of the council, which is comprised of the officers of all the subordinate granges in the county. At the same time, Glen Van Meter of Poe valley was named vice president and Mrs. L. B. Schroeder of Mallin was chosen secretary.

The meeting was one of four held regularly each year a month in advance of the Pomona grange's quarterly sessions. Like other such meetings, it was devoted largely to laying plans and drafting a program for introduction at the general executive session, and official reports on its decisions were to be withheld until the May 9 conclave at Mallin.

Two speakers addressed the council. A. W. Schupp spoke in behalf of the Klamath grange cooperative and Charles Wicklander, deputy state grangemaster from LaGrande discussed technical phases of group work within the grange organization.

Corresponding officers from each of the subordinate granges were divided in group conferences during most of the day.

The meeting convened at 11 a. m. and a luncheon was served at noon.

Next meeting of the council is set for Shasta View grange the evening of July 9.
