BIEBER MAY BUILD RAILWAY OVERPASS

BIEBER, Calif.—Construction of an overpass that will eliminate the grade crossing on the Hedding-Alitras highway at the north end of the Bieber railroad terminal is understood to be the purpose of an advertisement by the California state division of highways received here for publication.

The advertisement invites bids to be opened at Sacramento April 29 for construction of a steel and timber structure with concrete deck and approximately 54 miles of roadway to be graded and surfaced.

The grade crossing was created when the Great Northern railway's line from Klamath Falls was built across the highway in 1931. The overpass project is part of the federal-state grade separation program.

Accidental Shooting Death Case Verdict

BURNEY, Calif.—A finding of accidental shooting was made by Coroner Roy Higgins and Deputy Sheriff King of Redding after they had investigated the death of Leland L. Haynes, 24, a stock raiser, who was found dead Tuesday morning in a meadow on the Haynes ranch near here with his .22 caliber rifle by his side. An autopsy made by Dr. Curtis McGarbur showed that a bullet had gone into the heart.

Haynes was unmarried, a native of the Burney neighborhood and a son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard W. Haynes of Burney. Six sisters and three brothers survive him. Funeral services under Odd Fellows auspices were held at Burney Thursday.
