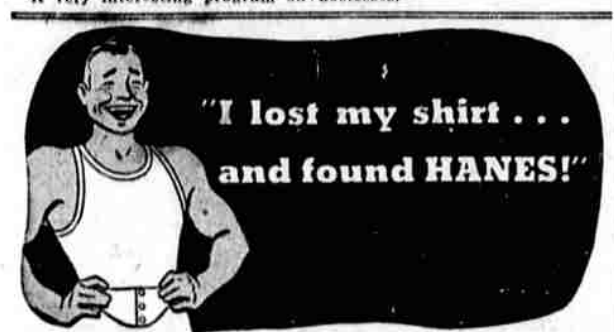

GEORGE CHASTAIN ISSUES STATEMENT

George Chastain, candidate for nomination for county clerk on the democratic ticket, issued his campaign statement Thursday. Here it is:

"I am a candidate for nomination of county clerk on the democratic ticket; I have had the honor and pleasure of serving you as your county clerk prior to the election of Mr. C. R. DeLapp and have also served as clerk of the circuit court.

"The county clerk's office is purely a clerical office; the county court audits and allows all bills against the county and the county clerk has nothing to say about how the county money is dispensed.

"I know every detail of the work of the county clerk's office and am able to do any part of it; I can and will work in harmony with the other county officers; I feel sure that I can reduce the expense of the clerk's office very materially and if nominated and elected I will conduct the office in an efficient, economical and courteous manner, with special privileges to none.

"I am financing my own campaign and am not tied up with any clique or group and if I am elected I will not be controlled by any group, but will run the office myself with the help of competent deputies to the best interest of all the people, with special privileges to none.

The cabinet then will draft the formal decree law.

It will be communicated instantly to the king whose approval, it was presumed, already has been given.

Then it will be read to the people from the balcony of the Plaza Venezia—Il Duce's frequent stage for dramatic appearances.

After that, the decree law will go to the chamber for approval. The chamber meets Monday.

Both Houses Work On Bills to Extend Nation's Defenses

WASHINGTON, May 7. (UP)—A preparedness-conscious congress worked smoothly Wednesday enacting two bills which will give America's armed forces more than a billion dollars of expense money next year, a record-breaking appropriation in the nation's peace-time history.

The house adopted a conference report on the \$572,446,842 army supply bill and passed it to the senate for minor adjustments. Of the fund, \$383,100,359 goes for military purposes and \$189,341,933 for non-military purposes.

The house provided \$41,055,000 for buying airplanes and \$8,518,994 for modernizing army defenses in Panama, Hawaii and along the Pacific coast. This modernization feature had been curtailed by the senate when it passed the bill.

The senate appropriations committee meanwhile was approving the \$531,068,707 naval supply

bill into which the house wrote conditional authorization for building two super battleships.

a roundup of members of Emperor Haile Selassie's force who had not taken to the hills.

After sifting their ranks carefully, squadrons of imported Carabinieri put the natives to work clearing up the wreckage of their own burned and pillaged town.

Major Bottai also sent out squads of infantrymen, lent by Marshal Pietro Badoglio, mounted Carabinieri and fast patrol cars to force the Ethiopian conceptions of peace into a European pattern.

Foreigners Are Safe

Safety for foreigners seemed established firmly and a survey of foreign legations, including the once-beleaguered American mission, convinced Italian authorities little actual damage had been suffered by non-natives.
