Announcing that at the end of March 1,455,822 persons were enrolled under 43,051 teachers, Hopkins added:

"There has been no thought, of course, of supplanting the regular school facilities, but there has been a wholesome broadening of the scope of this work, which has been eagerly received by adult unemployed and by teachers who were without professional opportunity, as well as by leading educators throughout the country, who have come to appreciate the significance of adult education."

The program, which is in addition to the part time jobs pro-

vided students by the \$50,000,000 national youth administration, furnished instruction at "emergency colleges" for 8,122 young men and women and correspondence courses for 16,703. Other types of instruction were:

General adult education, 744,638; literacy, 261,476; parent training, 89,669; nursery schools, 68,111; workers' education, 63,508.
