

RETAIL TRADE MOVES WITH WARM WEATHER

NEW YORK, June 5, (AP)—Although retail and wholesale trade expanded under seasonal demand last week, holiday shutdowns operated to keep industrial indices around previously established levels. Dun & Bradstreet said today in the weekly review of trade and industry.

"A rush to cover urgent needs benefited generously those lines of trade which were dependent for expansion on warm weather," the review said. "Retail distribution spread out rapidly, with purchases of seasonal goods amplified by special buying for weddings and graduations. Wholesale volume was lifted by the stronger flow of reorders and the release of larger fall commitments."

"With the long-awaited arrival of real summer temperatures, the surge in consumer buying was the strongest since the pre-Easter shopping season," the review continued. "Based on the abrupt rise in sales for the week and the bulge which will be encountered with the veterans' bonus distribution retailers are counting on June to build up the largest volume for the year. Summer furniture, rugs, sporting goods, camping outfits, luggage and apparel were among the best-selling items."

"There was more uniformity to the reports from the various cities, which revealed gains from the week preceding ranging from 3 to 15 per cent. This widened the estimated volume of retail sales for the country, as a whole, to 12 to 17 per cent over the corresponding 1935 showing."

Estate Matters Draw Attention of Circuit Judge

With all but current business cleared from its docket, the circuit court is turning its attention this month to cleaning up estate matters and other phases of probate work transferred to it from the county court by action of the state legislature.

Armed with an abstract of all unsettled estates, Judge Edward H. Ashurst has ordered citations served on 217 administrators and guardians whom the abstract shows have failed to make periodic accountings every six months as required by law.

The judge's procedure, he explained, is to demand immediate reports from these delinquent administrators. When the reports are presented, he audits them, and if there are unaccountable deficiencies or apparent mismanagement of funds, he discharges the administrator or guardian and appoints another with orders to sue the bondsman.

Judge Ashurst said his abstract reveals some cases where estates are still unsettled after as much as 15 years and others where there have been no reports for nearly as long.

Mayor Urges Klamath Folk to Support Celebration of Fourth in City

Mayor Willis Mahoney, in a proclamation issued Thursday, urged Klamath people to remain in the city for the Fourth of July, and to invite their friends to come here for the big Independence Day celebration sponsored by the American Legion.

Similar sentiments are being expressed generally by civic leaders. General support of Klamath people is expected to make the celebration one of the biggest in this section of the country, and to give it a push-off as an annual affair in this community.

Mayor Mahoney's proclamation, in full, follows:

"The American Legion, with the full co-operation of the business and civic organizations of the city, have completed plans to present to the people of Klamath county and of southern Oregon an outstanding entertainment program during the days of July 3, 4 and 5, inclusive.

"No expense has been spared in making this occasion one of the biggest events in the history of the city. From the standpoint of civic pride as well as from the standpoint of commercial value, it should command the enthusiastic support of all our people. It is the duty of every citizen to wholeheartedly join in making this event an outstanding success. We should forego visiting other parts of the country to celebrate, and remain at home and extend to our friends an invitation to visit Klamath Falls.

"No city on the coast has more to offer in the way of scenic beauty, industrial and civic development than has our own city. We should all take pride in making this known to the people throughout the state, and urge their attendance at this celebration.

"Let this event be the rebirth of a new sense of civic progress. Let us send Klamath Falls on its way to its rightful place in the sun as one of the great inland cities of the coast which it is destined to become if our own people will but point the way."

GEOLOGIST FROM BELGIUM VISITS

Dr. F. J. Corin, of the geological survey of Belgium, with headquarters in Brussels, left Klamath Falls Thursday after several days' visit in this area.

He is making a five months' tour of the United States, studying various geological problems in the field.

He has visited many of the national parks in his trip from New York to the Pacific coast, and will return via Glacier and Yellowstone national parks.

On Tuesday Dr. Corin visited Crater Lake with John Doerr, Jr., park geologist. The Belgian visitor was enthusiastic about the lake, and declared it to be the most impressive sight he has yet seen in America.

On Wednesday Doerr and the European geologist visited the lava beds inspecting lava tubes

and the black lava flow, as well as Glass mountain.

Dr. Corin was vastly interested in the scenery, as well as geological formations of this area.

While at the lava beds Wednesday he stated that one of the principal impressions he has gained from his travels in America, is the grand scale of the scenery. The same sights may be viewed in other parts of the world, he said, but never in such magnitude.

Although Dr. Corin has traveled extensively in Europe and Africa, this is his first visit to America.

He will spend several days in Portland before leaving for the east.
