

## FLORAL PARADE ATTRACTS THROUGHS

PORTLAND, Ore., June 12. (AP)—The grand floral parade of majestic floats, snappy bands and trim marching units wound through downtown Portland today, bringing bursts of applause from thousands of rose-festival visitors.

Hundreds of thousands of roses and other flowers were embodied in more than 60 floats which vied for prizes in the depiction of the rose festival spirit.

One group that drew loud applause was the troop of 27 northwest mounted police from Canada.

More than 50,000 persons, an all-time record, watched the red-coated mounties and their spirited horses perform their musical ride as parts of the festival programs at Multnomah stadium the past two nights.

A display from Newark, N. J., won a new event in the rose display this year, the air-mail show. Exhibits from numerous cities arrived on the opening day and were nearly as fresh as Portland's own entries.

A 4-H club member, Florence Frink who lives near Portland, entered the grand sweepstakes winning rose, but was not here to see her exhibit. A long-stemmed, coral-yellow Phyllis rose won the honor for her while she was at Corvallis attending a 4-H club summer school.

Allentown, Pa., placed second in sweepstakes of the inter-city mail show competition.

The best general exhibit came from Salt Lake City, Utah, while Tampa, Fla., sent the most distant entry.

## New Constitution Gives Freedom to People of Russia

MOSCOW, June 12, (UP)—A new constitution, providing sweeping social reforms and granting democratic freedom which the soviet union has never known, was approved by the presidium of the Central Executive committee Thursday.

The constitution grants the right to vote to all persons over 18, with equal rights for women. It replaces the Central Executive committee, present supreme power. The exact number of deputies will be fixed later, based on the population. Complete freedom of speech and press, formerly limited to those not attacking the government, is ensured.

In addition, it provides for elimination of franchise distinctions and free education for all. Meetings, conferences and street demonstrations may be held openly "for the purpose of strengthening the socialist system."

The church is separated from the state and schools, free to pursue the purpose for which it is established. Freedom of religious cults and freedom of anti-religious propaganda are recognized as privileges of the citizens.
